The explanations get more complicated with each attempt to understand the man. But actually his reason is quite simple.

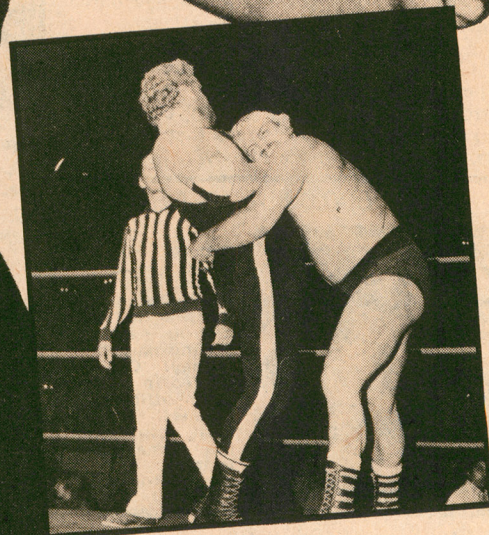
"I couldn't stand myself anymore. I'd wake up in the morning and ask myself, 'Why? Why do I even bother?'"

"My life became a total waste. My friends ignored me.

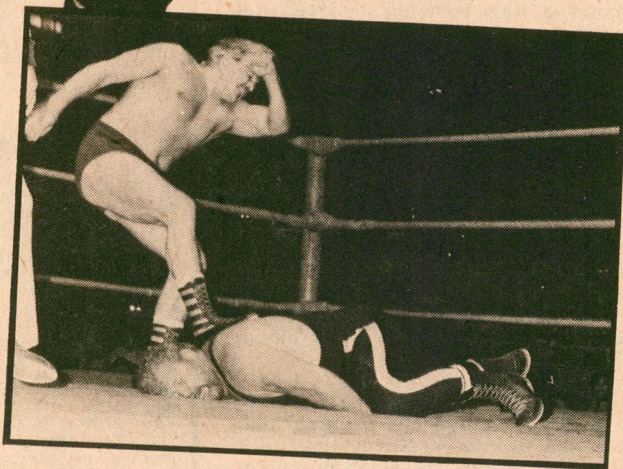
It all came down to me. It was my decision.

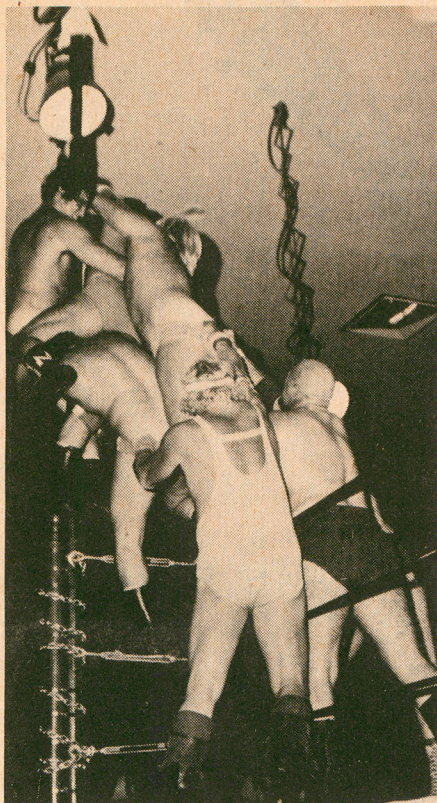

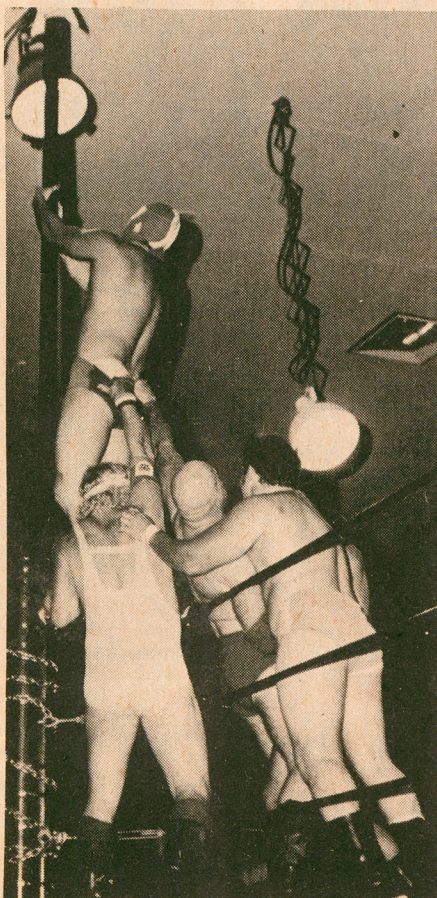

ALL EYES WERE gazing intently at the \$5,000 check which rested atop the 15-foot pole. Gazing most intently at the check were 24 eyes belonging to 12 wrestlers who were going to try and climb the pole to retrieve the check.

Among those staring at the prize were Andre the Giant, Nick Kozak, Lord Al Hays, Terry Funk, and Stan Hanson. They were all mentally estimating what fraction of a second it would take them to shinny up the pole and grab the check.

The buzzer sounded and the match began. Each man stood poised but still, waiting for the first person to break for the pole. The tension could be cut with a knife.

Finally, Terry Funk broke for the

Good. Because my method has to do with something that many people find distasteful . . . yes, even *laugh at*! The subject brings out strong opinions in almost everyone — pro or con — and may get a pretty strong reaction from you, too.

The subject is horse racing.

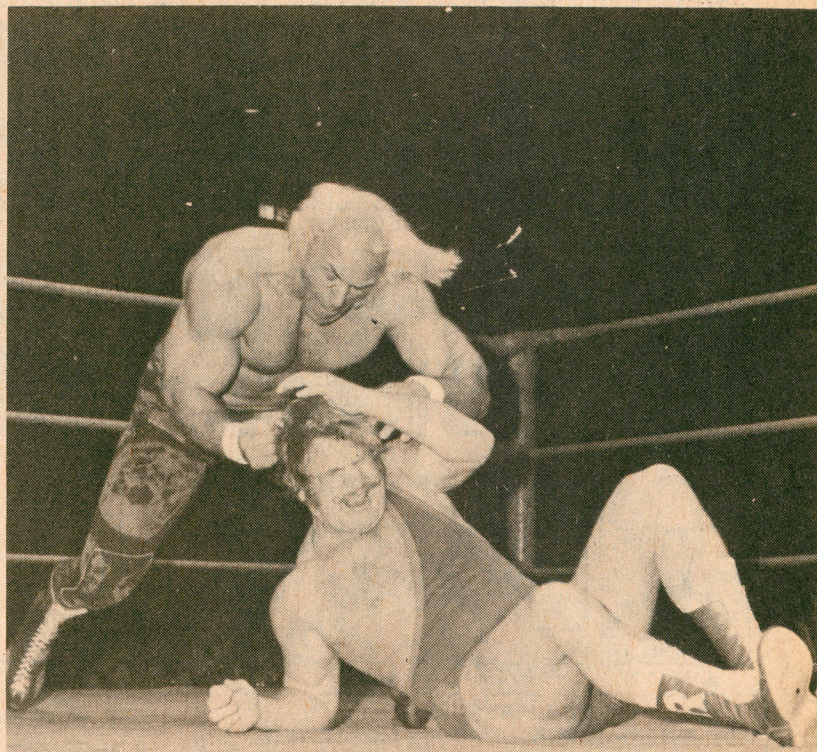
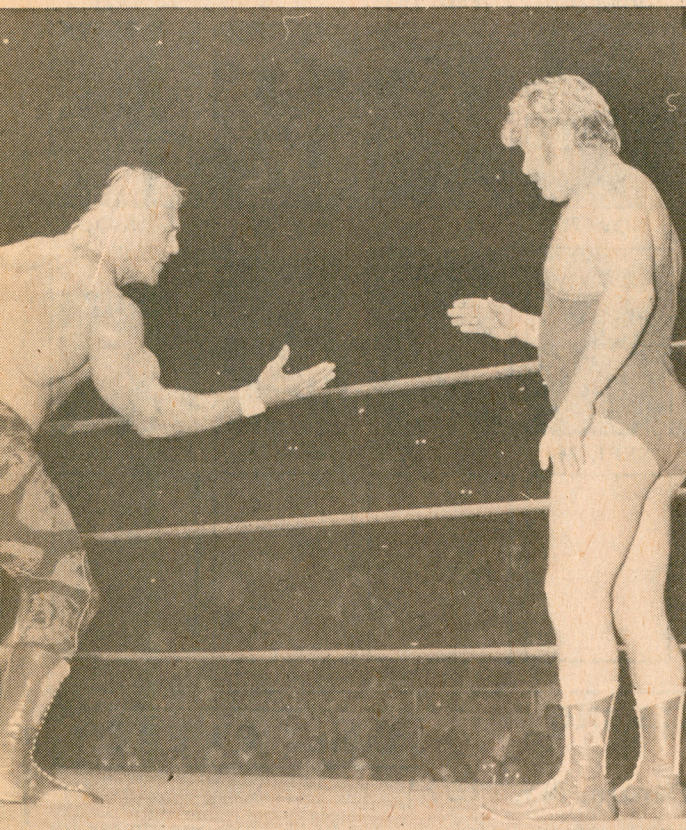
Turning away from the mirror with a growl, Bastien began a series of kicks and punches at various inanimate objects. The onslaught lasted a good 15 minutes.

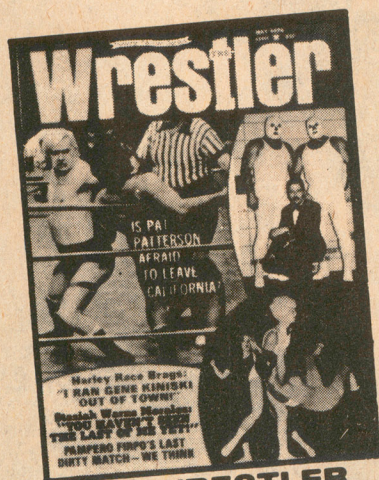

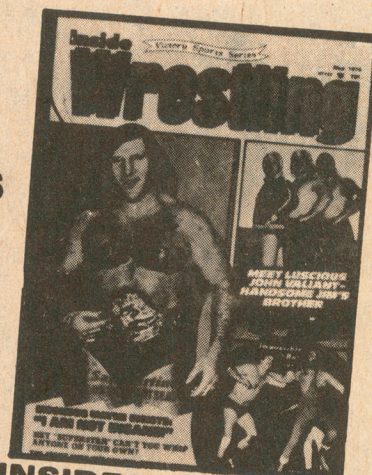
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"GET UP, BORIS! YOU WON!"

Boris remembers a different story, a more bitter and complex explanation for the hatred between the two men.

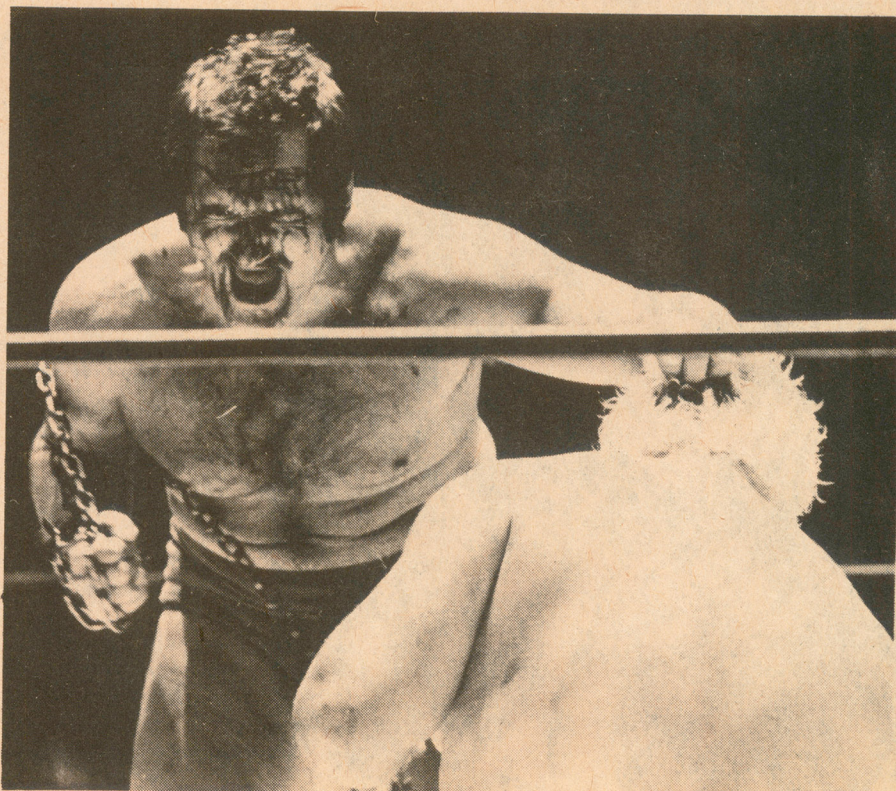
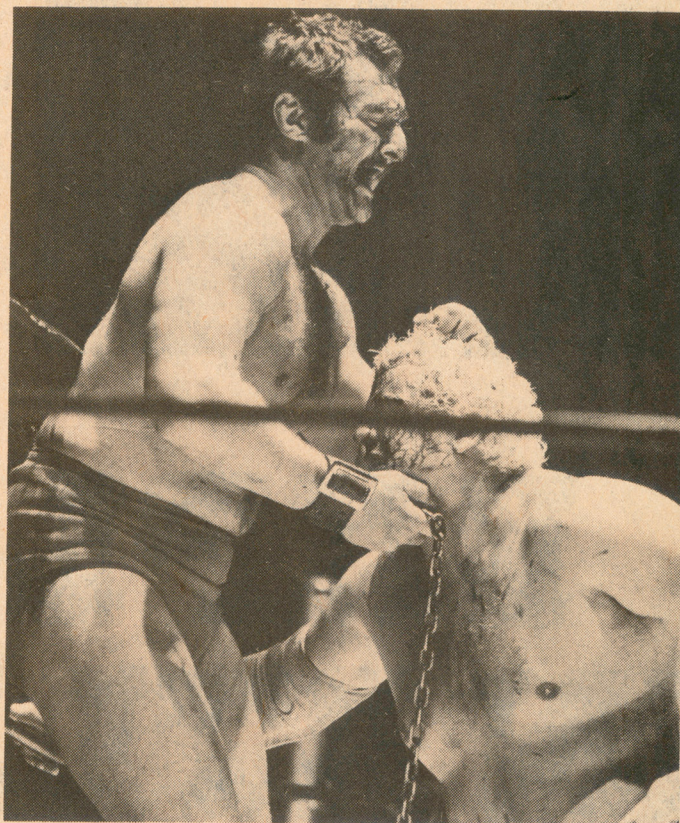

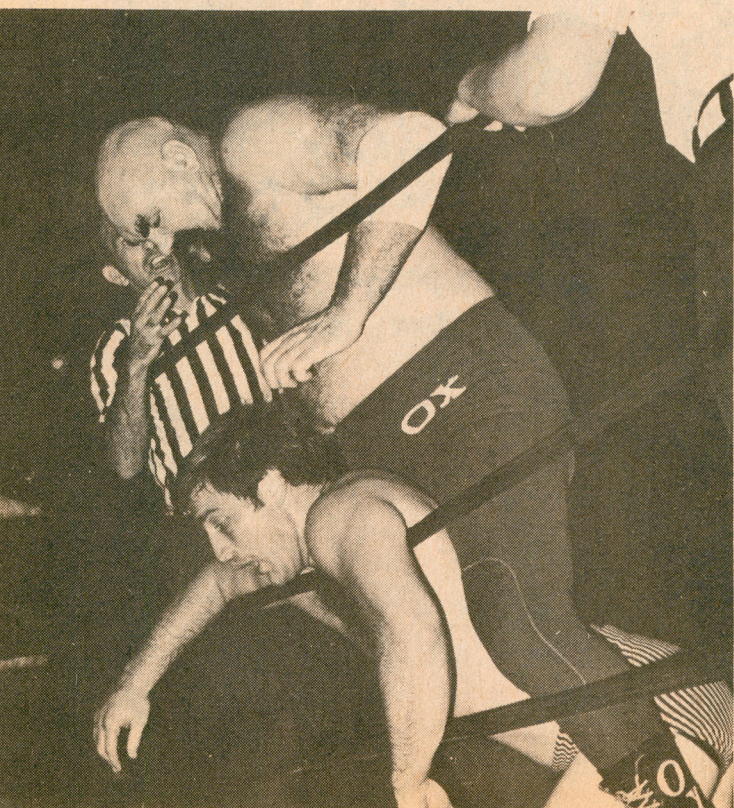

When Ernie Ladd hung up his football spikes for wrestling boots, Ox Baker moved hell and high water to get a chance to wrestle him. If he couldn't get his dream of being a football player, he could destroy that dream in the form of Ernie Ladd. All the anguish he had suffered traveling from tryout camp to tryout camp could be revenged when they carried the former football star out on a stretcher.

Baker didn't cripple the rookie Ernie Ladd — but he came close enough to earn Ladd's undying hatred. Ox became the first man Ernie Ladd learned to hate as a professional wrestler. It was hatred that

was constantly rekindled over the years.

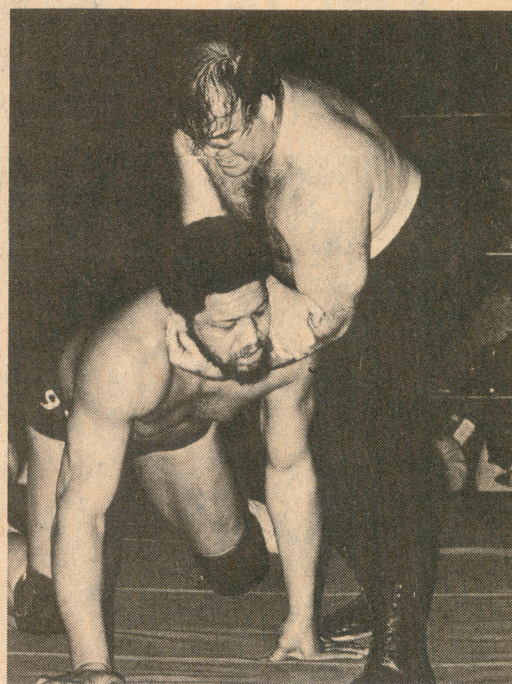
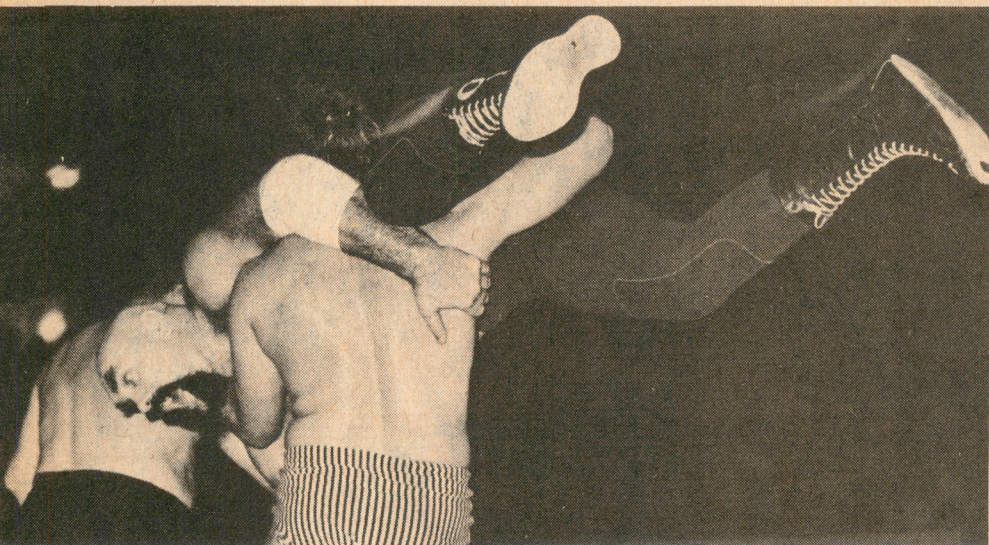
"I know why Baker hates me," Ladd told reporters, "because I'm an athlete and he's a phony. He couldn't hack it as a football player and he can't hack it as a wrestler. He steals, *steals* the holds of others and then has the gall to say he invented the holds. He was born nothing and he's living up to his potential. If he wasn't so vicious he'd be pitiful."

When Baker heard Ladd's accusations they had the effect of throwing a pinch of salt into the sea. Ox hates Ernie so much nothing could make it any worse. If Ox could have seen past his anger, however, he would have realized Ladd's hatred now matched his own.

"But I learned," Ron remembers. "He didn't intend it, but Mauler gave me an education that hurt too much to forget. I'll go anywhere to show that snake how much he taught me!"

The burning hatred between the two teams was at a boiling point. Each team vowed to end the other's career for forever — one way or another!

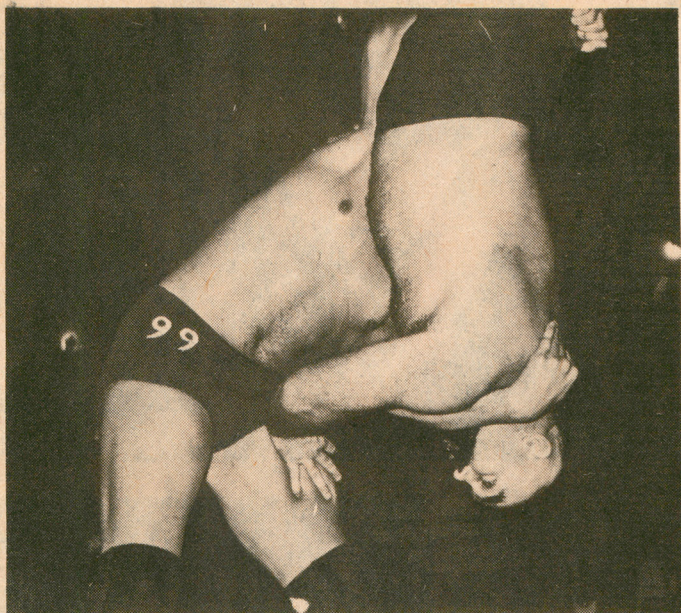
As for the Missouri Mauler, when questioned about Pritchard, he asks, "Ron who? I can't keep track of all the young punks I might batter into the mat. If he wants to get at me he knows where I am. Tell this Don whatever-his-name-is that if he enjoys getting kicked around I'll be glad to oblige."

However, those close to the Mauler say he knows very well who "Don whatever-his-name-is" is and he respects him greatly. They point out that a wrestler gives it to a rookie

only because he wants to scare him quickly. You worry about scaring only those you feel will cause you trouble.

It was natural Pritchard would go to Ladd for advice, former gridiron star to gridiron star. Ladd would be in perfect position to tell Ron what to remember—and what to forget. There are moves a professional football player does almost by instinct that would mean disaster in wrestling. Who would know these pitfalls better than Ladd?

At the same time, Baker and the

Missouri Mauler announced they had become a tag team and were ready to take on anyone. Pritchard had told Ladd how much he hated the Mauler, so it was three seconds between the time Ladd heard about the new tag team and the time he got Pritchard on the phone.

"When do we get together to train?" was the first question Ron asked. The issue was settled.

The match was scheduled for Atlanta three weeks from the phone call. That gave Ernie Ladd three weeks to train Pritchard into becoming his tag team partner. It was a time for total concentration for Ron and his football discipline came in very handy. He worked and learned day and night without rest.

"It was the most intensive train-

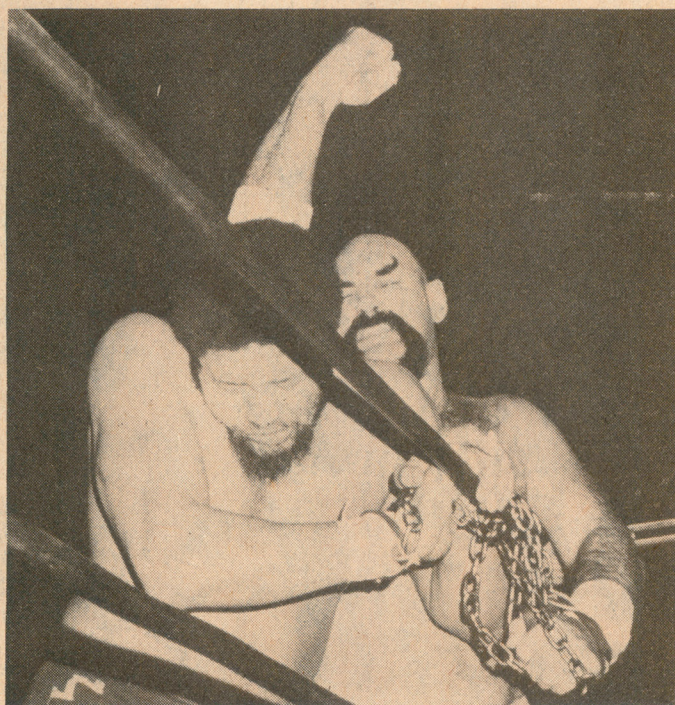

ing of my life," Pritchard declared afterward. "Ernie drew as many parallels between what we had to do and football plays as possible. He's incredibly imaginative. He also picked up mistakes I was making and corrected them. Luckily, both of us had been on teams since we were in junior high school so teamwork is second nature to us. That was about the only advantage we had over those two. They had the experience and the desire to cripple. That's very different from wanting to win."

In an interview before the match, Ox Baker stated, "I'm going to shut Ernie Ladd up once and for all. I'm going to separate his jaw from the rest of his head and hang it over my mantelpiece like a small-game trophy."



Other times Ladd and Baker have wrestled against each other include one of the most savage chain matches in the history of the sport (above and left). It ended with both men bleeding but wanting to get at the other another time.

When Ladd heard the threat he asked, "Who did he steal the line from?" It was going to be that kind of evening.

Two seething giants, Ox Baker and Ernie Ladd, were the first to wrestle. Baker wanted to kill, as did Ladd. But Ladd was determined to be cunning. So as Baker charged, Ladd sidestepped. Ladd's arms slashed through the air and Ox Baker was sent crashing to the canvas.

Baker wasn't hurt but the crash cooled his blood. He would have to win by using his brains as well as his brawn.

Baker, still stretched out on the mat, saw Ladd's knees coming down quickly on his chest. As Ladd sailed through the air Ox quickly twisted away. Ernie's knee smashed into the mat.

Pain shot through Ladd's leg. He hobbled over and tagged Pritchard.

Ron went into action. It was the moment he had been trained for.

Baker laughed when he saw what happened. He quickly tagged the Missouri Mauler.

"I'm saving myself for you!" he shouted to Ladd, who was feverishly rubbing his knee.

Ron went out to meet the man who had tortured him in Texas. The Mauler snarled and rushed in. Ron waited tensely. He didn't expect what came next. A vicious kick by the Mauler shot into Ron's stomach. The young wrestler doubled over in agony.

Then Baker asked to finish him off and the Mauler "graciously" complied. But when Baker went out, he found Ron was far from ready to be "finished off". Before he knew what happened, Ox Baker found himself sailing through the air from Ron Pritchard's flip.

At this point the Mauler was outraged and he came storming into the ring. That was all Ladd needed. It was now a free-for-all.

It was a brawl unequalled in the history of Atlanta wrestling. The four men tore at each other throwing punches, kicks, and holds that are meant to end a career. After 10 minutes of murderous mayhem, the Missouri Mauler snuck up on Ladd (who was pulverizing Baker) and trapped Ernie in a choke hold.

With Ladd out of the way, Baker went after Pritchard. He faked a move and before Ron realized it he was sent sailing.

Once along the ropes, Baker straddled Ron's back and began to rub his neck along the ropes. The flesh along his neck began to burn intolerably and Ron could hardly breathe.

The referee was trying to break both illegal holds but neither Baker nor Mauler would listen. He then disqualified the two but that did no good either. Finally, the special police were called in and had to wrench everybody free.

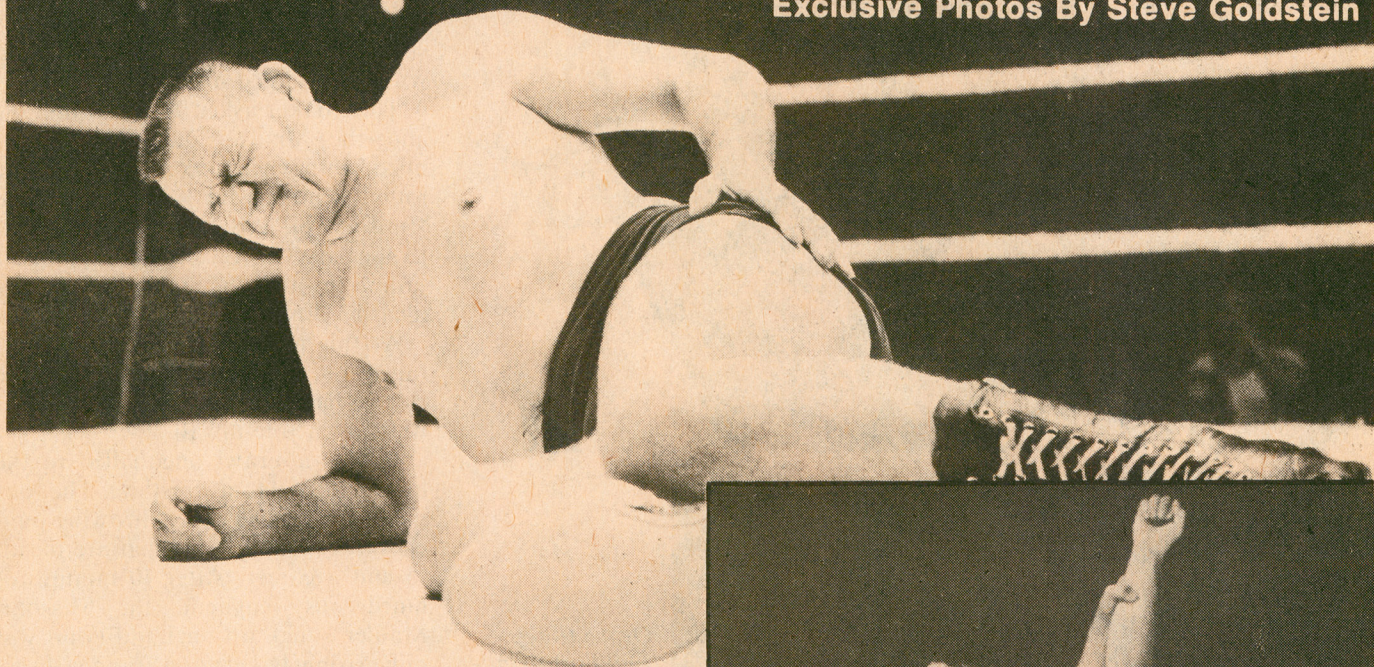
"We were green," Ladd said after the match. "We were disorganized as a team. That's to be expected for a first time. Considering this was the first match, we did damn well. We had them until they started to choke the hell out of us. But we'll be ready for them next time. If there is a next time."

"There'll be a next time," Ron Pritchard said with conviction.

Ernie smiled and the two men shook on it. □

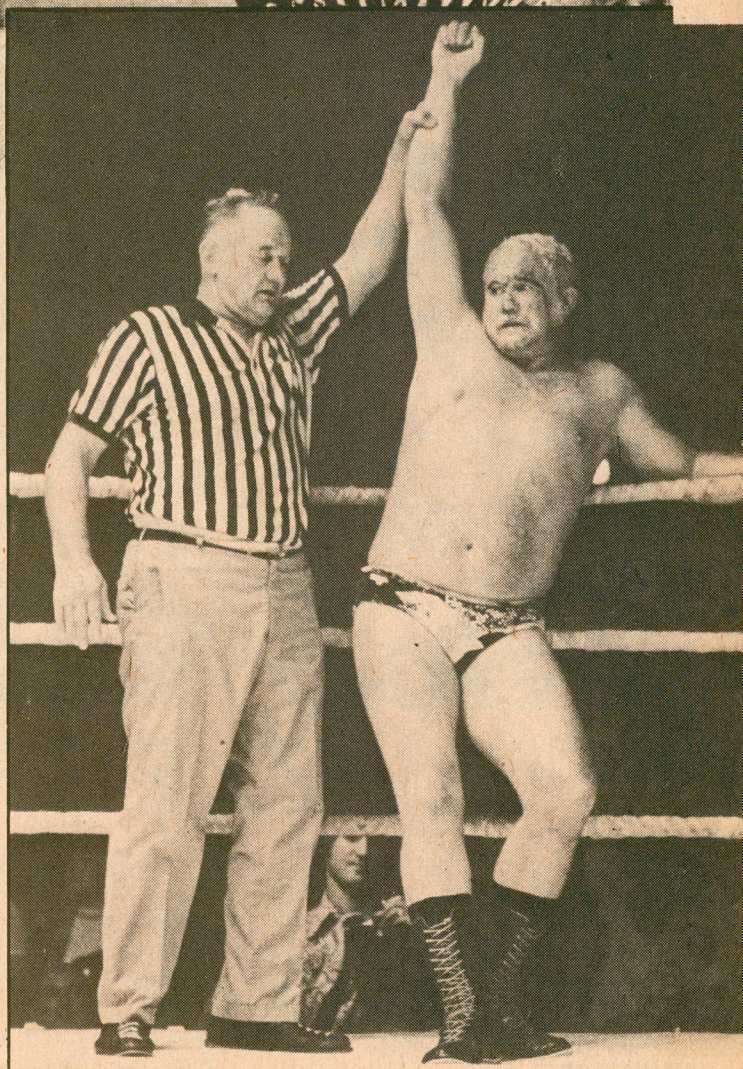

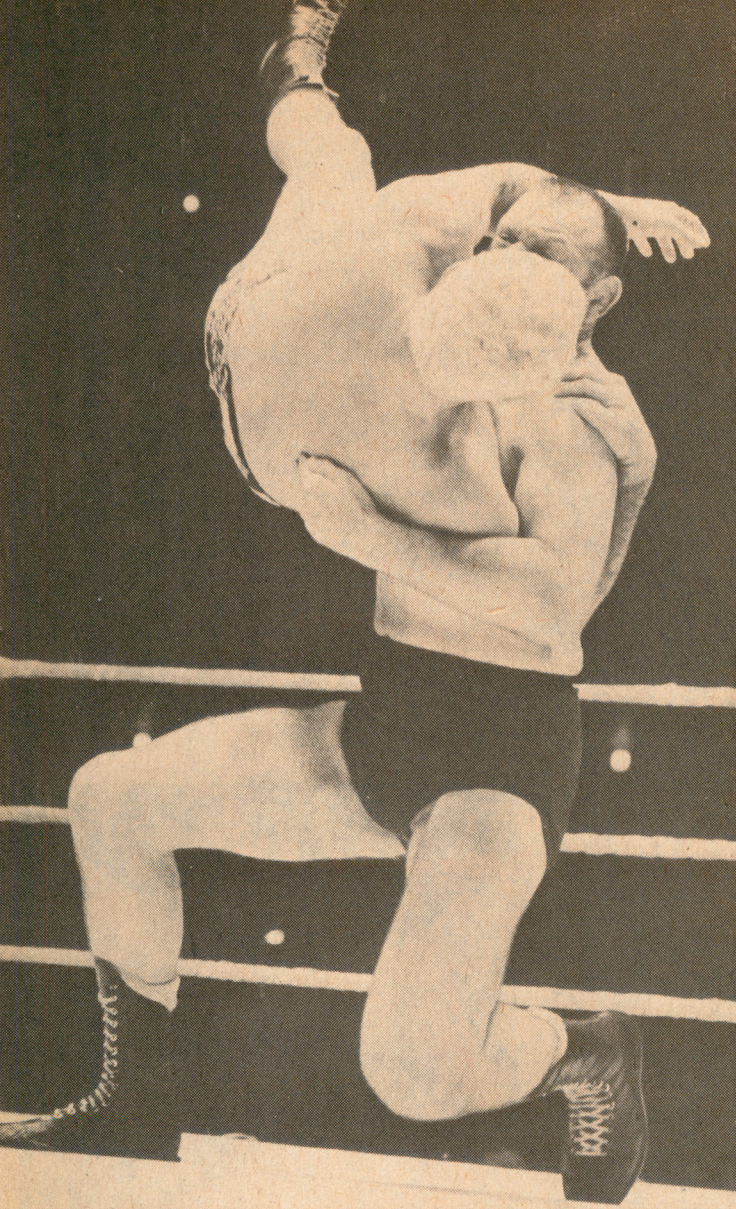

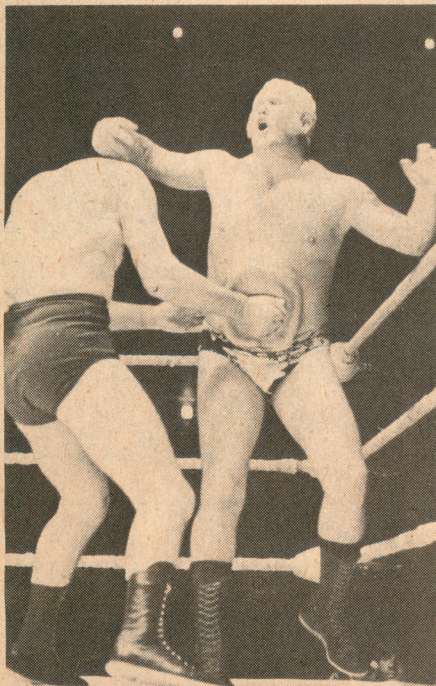
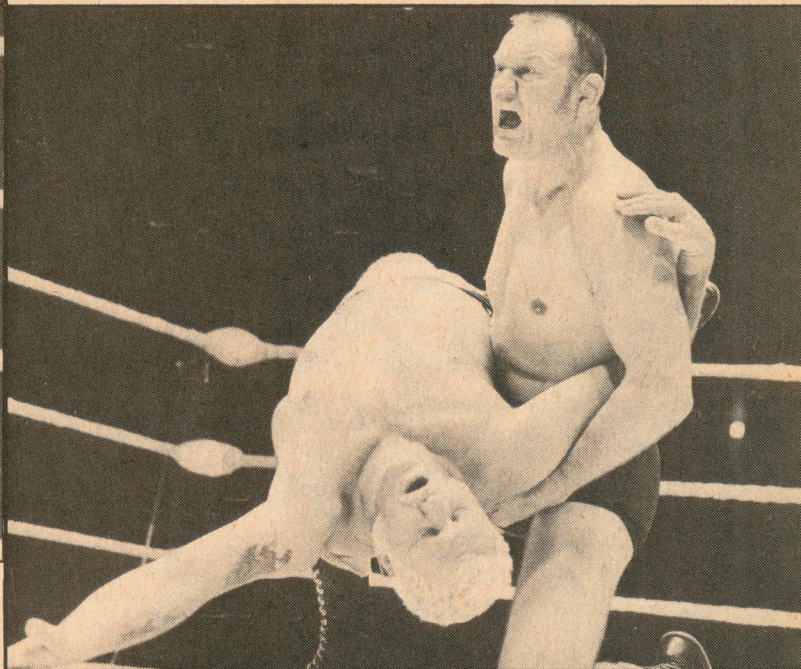
tory to sheer luck considering the punishment Race absorbed. But Harley tells it differently.

"Oh I murdered him!" he roared. "I killed him. I never thought he would get up off the canvas. When I walked out of that ring I left Gene Kiniski for dead.

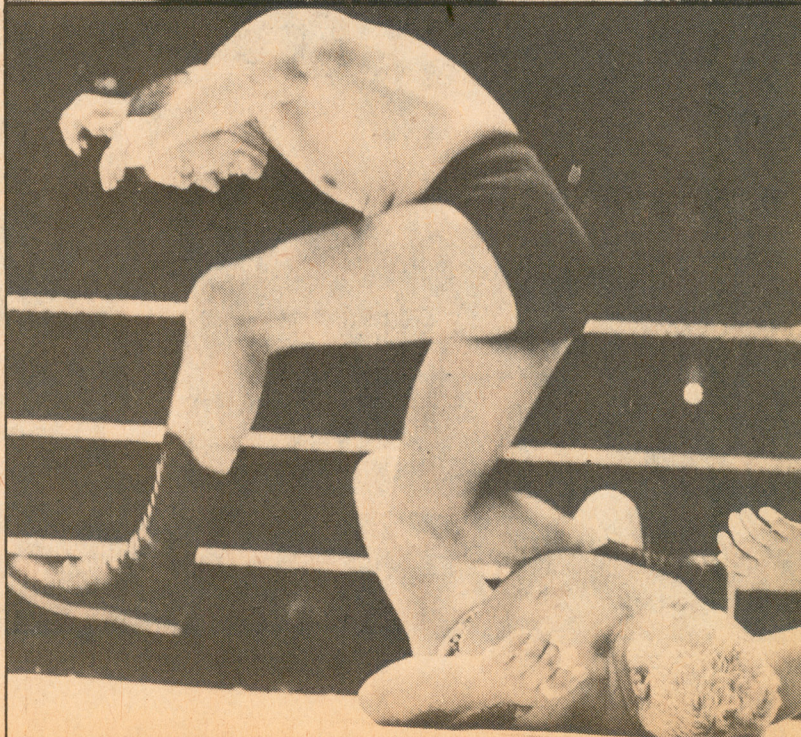
"And guess what? I got a phone call from a friend of mine this morning. He told me Kiniski hightailed it to Canada right after I whipped him. He was so scared he left the country!"

Kiniski did admit that he lost the

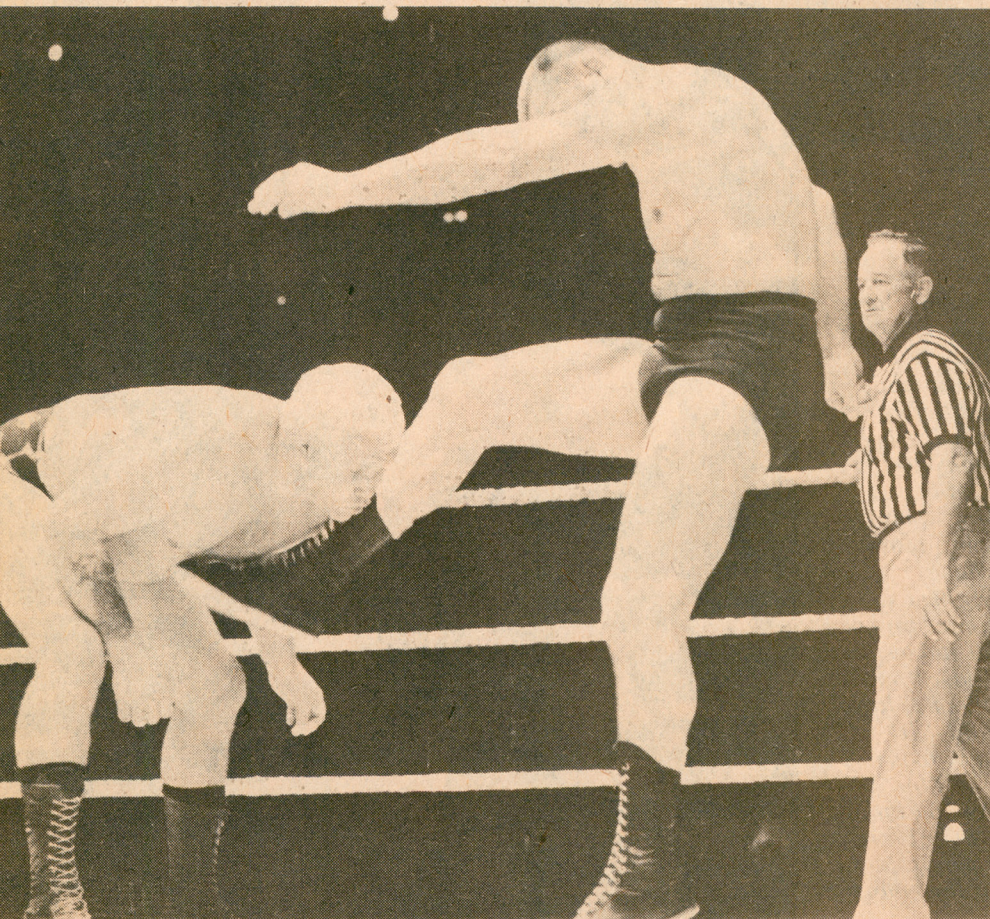
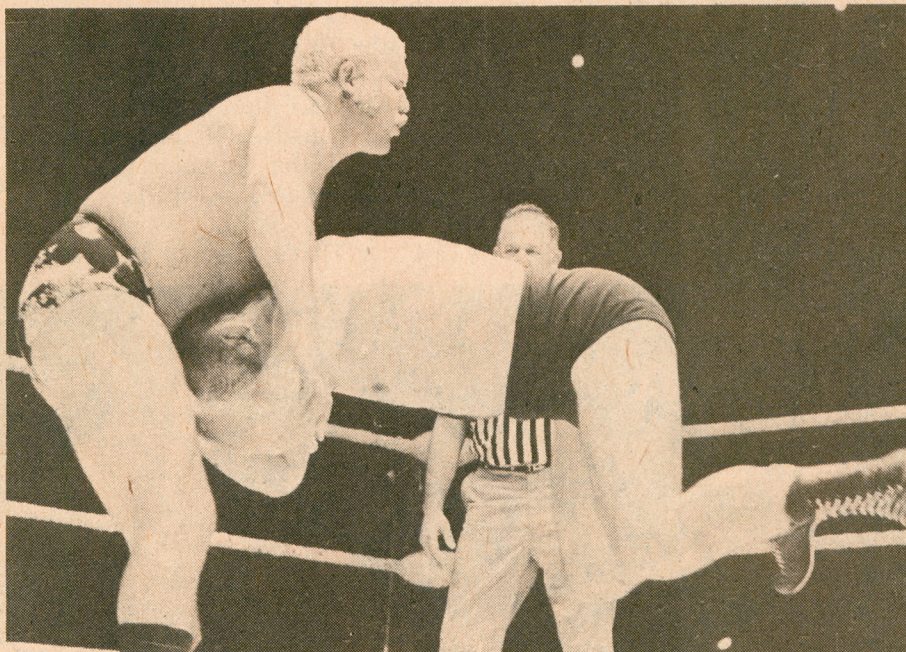

"Hell, did you see the match? I had him cryin' and bleedin' during the entire thing. He took all the punishment. He just got lucky at the

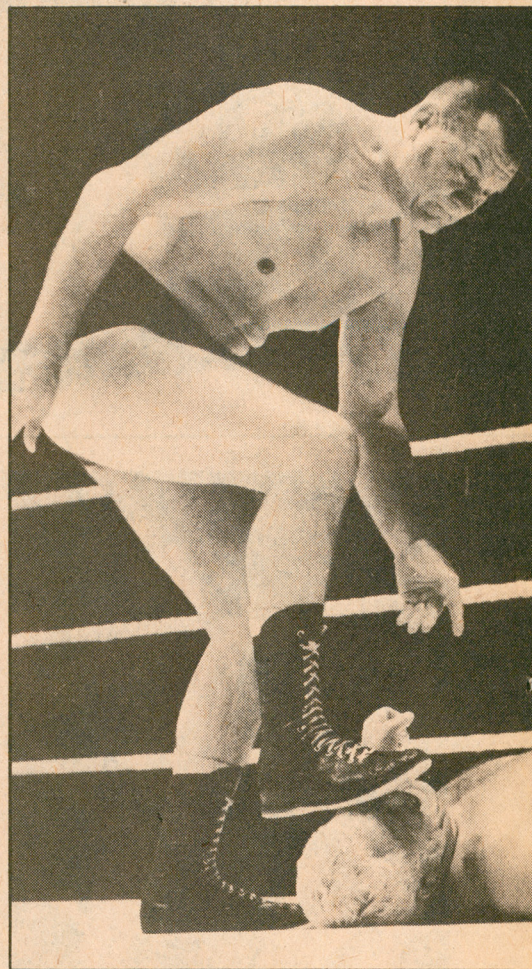
end."

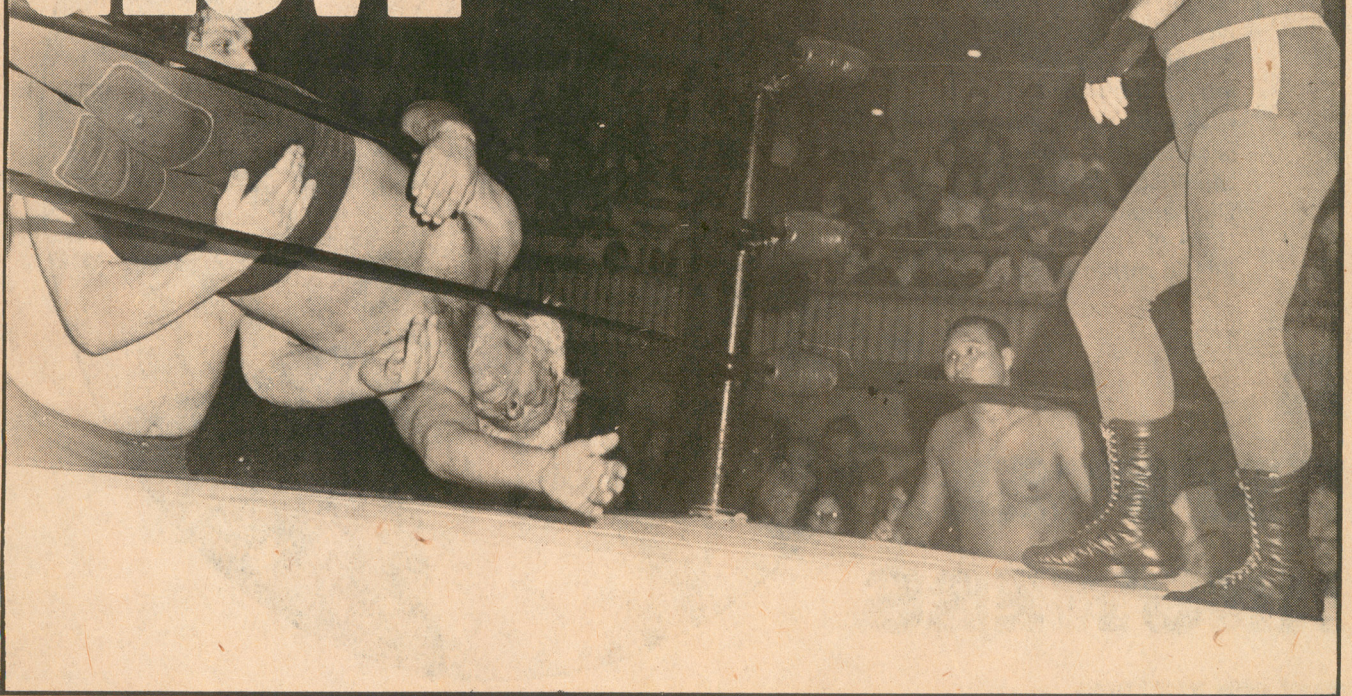

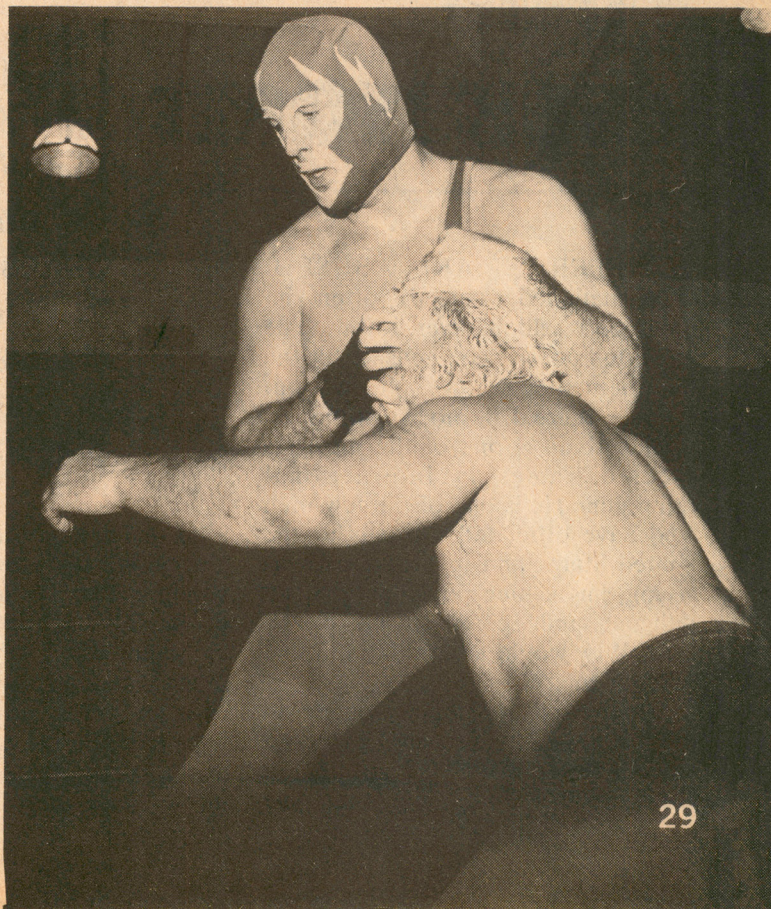

A REFEREE ANSWERS YOUR QUESTIONS

REFEREEES ARE ABUSED, maligned, cursed, often injured and seldom ever loved. The pay often doesn't compensate for the treatment they receive. Yet without referees there'd be no wrestling.

Dick Kroll is one of the most respected names in international refereeing. He is one of the few men who have officiated throughout the United States and in Canada. He is young, has a nice personality, is intelligent and seems to be totally sane. Why would a man like that become a referee?

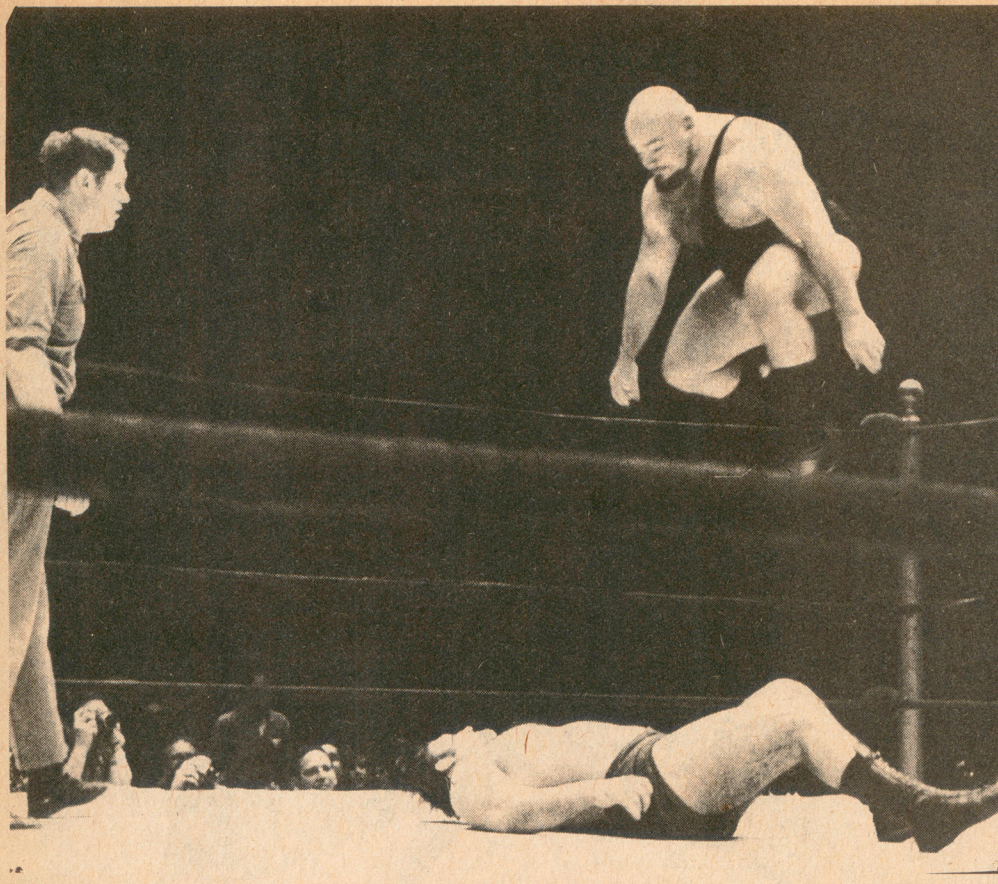
"I can't exactly put my finger on it," Dick laughed during an interview in New York's Madison Square Garden. "It's something that just

We're always getting letters from fans complaining about referees—what they did do or what they didn't do. Dick Kroll is a rare breed of referee. He officiates throughout the United States, in N.W.A., and A.W.A. and W.W.W.F. territories. And in this exclusive interview, Dick answers some of the questions which have been plaguing fans for years.

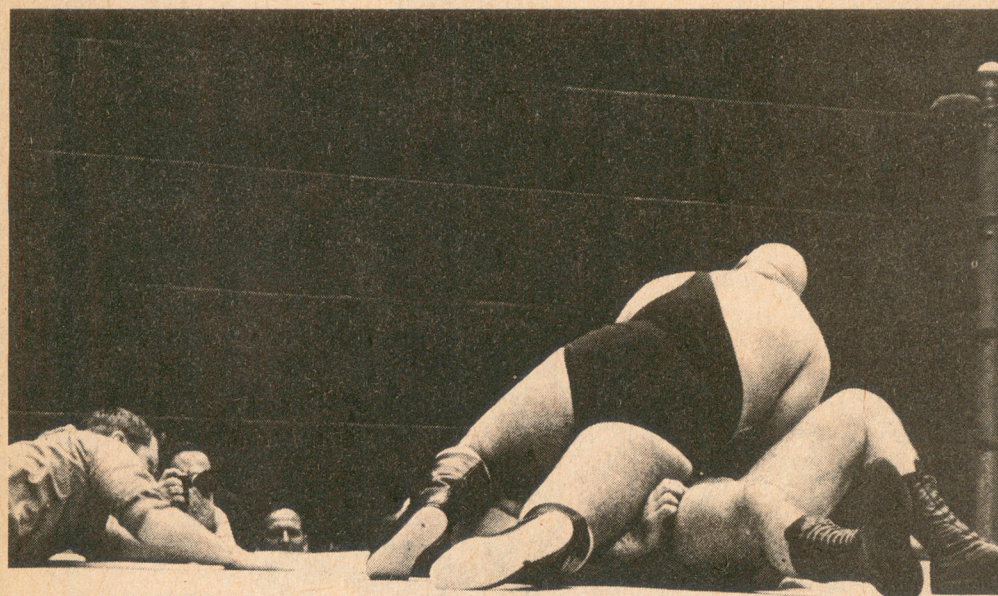
kind of happened to me.

"I used to wrestle when I was younger but I wasn't experienced enough to ever hope to make it in the big time. But I loved the sport so much I knew I wanted to remain in it in some capacity. One day I was watching the matches in a small arena I won't name. The referee was injured and there wasn't a backup

since the arena was so small. I saw what happened and I ran to the promoter and volunteered my services. I told him I refereed high school and amateur matches. Of course, I never had, but I'd seen enough on TV and in person to believe I could do it. I look back on that incident now and I realize I was terrible, probably because I

was so scared. I bluffed my way through the whole thing. Evidently I was good enough so that the promoter asked me to serve as backup. It meant not having to pay for a ticket so I agreed. Meanwhile, I watched referees every chance I could. I asked hundreds of questions and picked up pointers at every match. When the referee at that

small arena retired, I took over.

"Eventually I came to New York, took the licensing test and passed. I was a fully-certified referee for the World Wide Wrestling Federation. But I never stopped reading or asking questions or watching other referees. You never stop learning in this business."

Dick is unique in that he works all

territories in the United States—another facet of his career which came about rather by accident.

"I happened to be in Florida on vacation," he recalled, "and I went to see the wrestling matches. One of the referees didn't show up and since a few of the wrestlers knew me from W.W.W.F. territory they suggested I step in. I agreed. Then I found out the match I'd be handling. Johnny Valentine vs. Eddie Graham. What a war that was! But I managed to get out of it alive and so did Valentine and Graham, so I guess word got around that I could work outside of New York where there aren't as many restrictions as there are here. Since then, whenever I travel somewhere, if I let a promoter know I'll be there he'll usually take advantage of the fact that a Madison Square Garden referee is available and use me. It's a status thing for some of them to get a referee from the Garden. In the past year I've worked New York, Boston and Washington for the W.W.W.F., Florida and California for the N.W.A. and Wisconsin and Minneapolis for the A.W.A."

New York fans complain that cage matches, brass knuckles matches, girls' matches, battle royals and such aren't allowed in that state. As a referee who has worked all territories, you have handled those kinds of matches. Do you think it's about time New York had them too?

"That's hard to say," he noted, "because so far those kind of matches haven't resulted in the kind of incidents that the Commission in New York fears. The Commission is worried about the possibility of a wrestler getting killed. They want to protect the wrestlers just as they want to protect the boxers. You remember Boxing's tragic Benny "Kid" Paret incident. They want to make

THE MATCH THAT MUST **NEVER** BE MADE!

Once the best of friends, Chief Jay Strongbow and Jim Valiant are out to rip each other apart. But no promoter dares put them into the ring together. Here's why . . .

NOT TOO LONG ago, Jim Valiant and Chief Jay Strongbow were the closest of friends. They dined together, traveled together and even spent Thanksgiving and Christmas together.

They also clicked as a tag team. From the first day they teamed, the Chief and Valiant won 25 of their first 26 matches. The 26th is the one Strongbow would like to forget. That was the match that

broke the Chief's heart. Because that was the match when he began to realize his best friend—Jim Valiant—had turned on him.

"It's a damn shame what happened," a saddened Jay Strongbow recalled. "Here was a kid who could have had everything. But he fell in with bad company and now... well... who knows? But I'm getting ahead of myself. Let me start at the beginning.

"When I first met Jim I thought he was just another guy looking to make a quick buck as a villain. He had the typical 'look'—the long, bleached-blond-looking hair, the flashy, sequin-covered jackets, everything a young wrestler wanting to be a villain thinks he should have. But the first time I saw him wrestle I realized I was wrong—or so I figured.

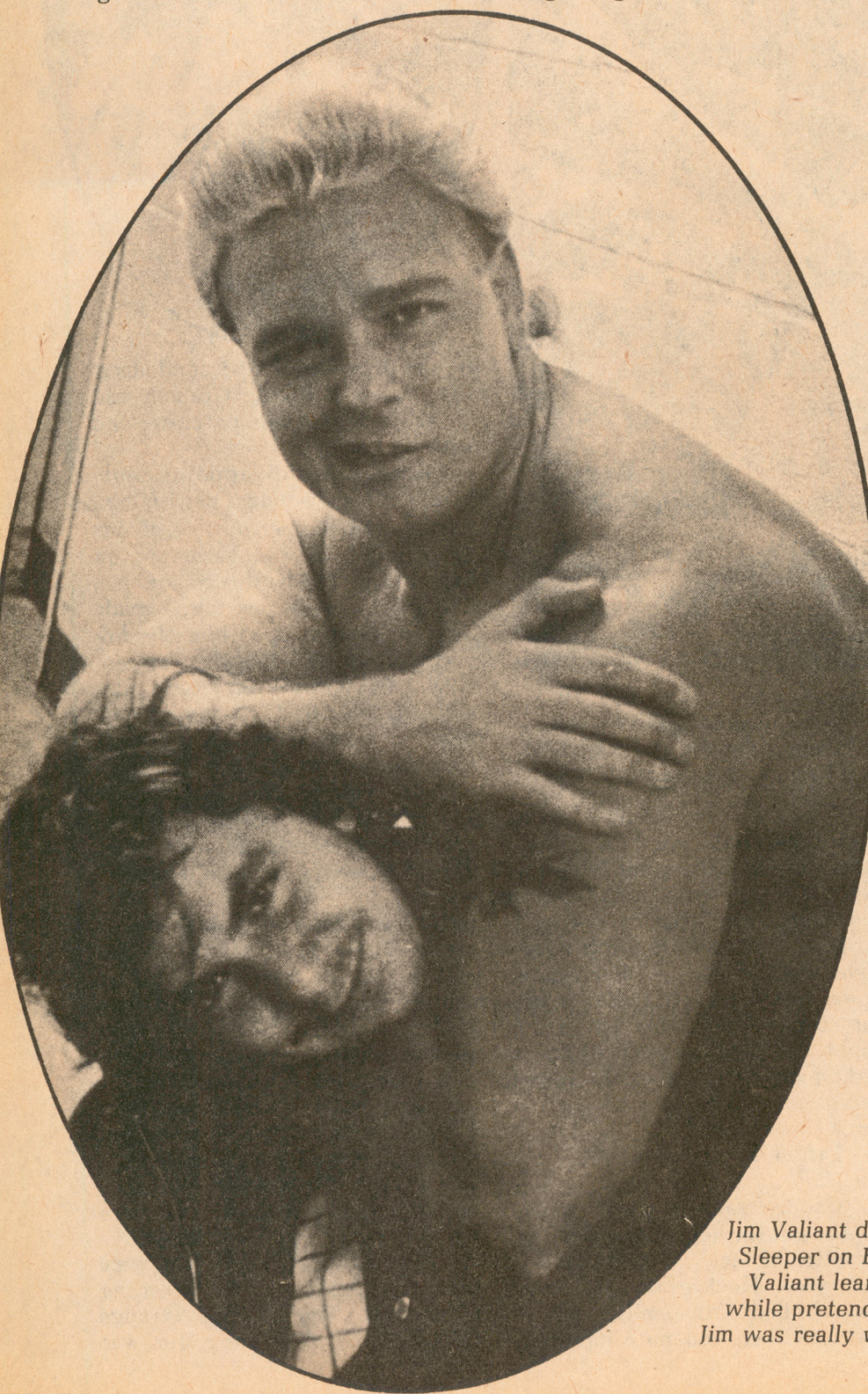
"His opponent was Tony Marino, a clean, scientific wrestler. Valiant and Toney went at it for 20 minutes and it was clean all the way. I didn't see as much as a closed fist. The time limit elapsed and the bout was declared a draw. Valiant and Marino clasped hands enthusiastically and walked back to the dressing room together. That was where I joined them. Both Tony and I complimented Jimmy for staying within the rules and putting up such a good showing in his first match. I told him how nice it was to see an up-and-coming young wrestler who didn't kick and bite and gouge. He thanked us."

"I always wrestled by the rule book, gentlemen," Valiant told Strongbow. "I'm a wrestler—not a back alley gutter-fighter."

"In the weeks following," the Chief continued, "I kinda took an interest in this young man. He was winning all his matches scientifically and skillfully. I thought he had a hell of a future in this sport. The combination of his good looks and a sort of magnetism he had with fans was making him a particularly big attraction, especially among the women.

"After the matches one night Jim asked me to join him for dinner. I agreed, and during the meal he asked if I'd be willing to help him with his career. He said he still had a lot he wanted to learn and plenty of wrinkles to iron out.

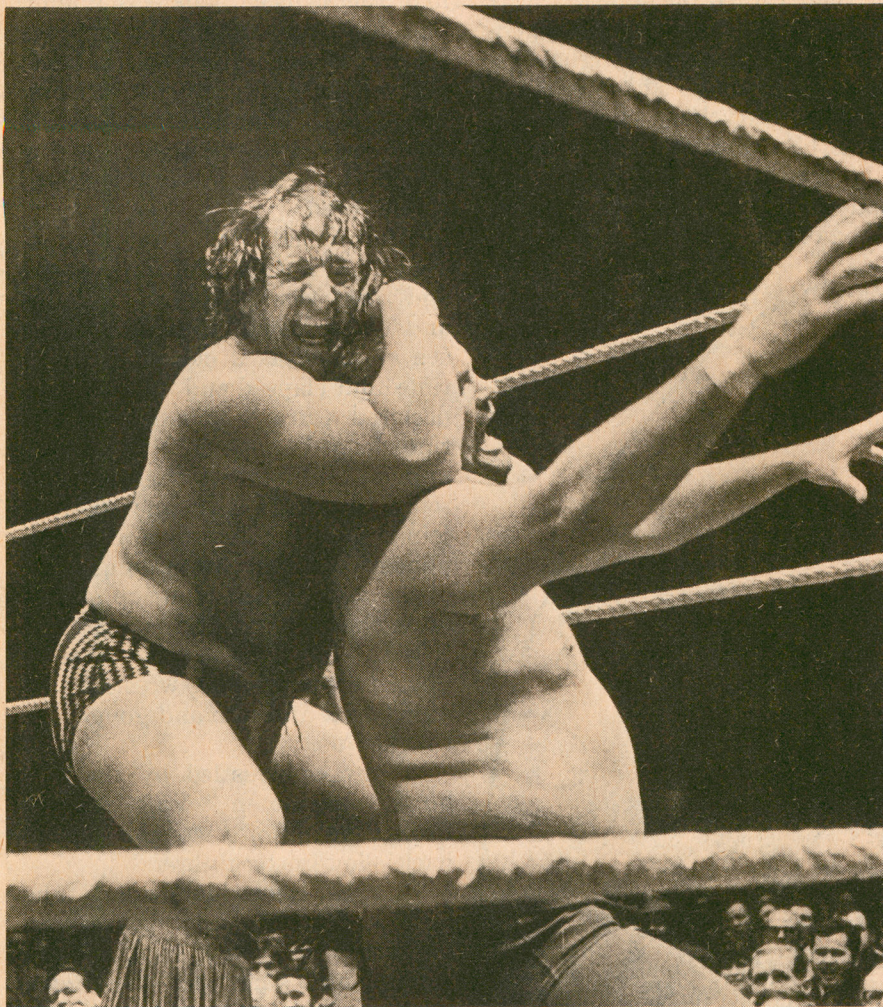
"To tell the truth, I was flattered he asked me. I readily agreed, but I told him it would be on one condition. If I taught him all I knew, he'd have to team with me so we could get a shot at the two guys I hate most in this world—Tarzan

Tyler and Luke Graham—the W.W.W.F. tag-team champions.

"'You've got a deal,' Valiant told me. We shook hands on it to seal the bargain and I told Jim to meet me in the gym at noon. There I'd begin my program of teaching him all the holds I'm an expert at, including the one he seemed particularly interested in—the Sleeper.

"Jim arrived at 12 on the button. We warmed up for awhile and then went over to the mats for a sparring session. This was the first time I'd ever really seen him 'close up,' as we say, and I was more impressed than ever. We exchanged holds for about 10 minutes and then took a breather. After five more minutes of instruction, he became kind of restless.

"'When are you going to teach me the Sleeper?' he asked. I should have realized it then, but he seemed especially concerned with learning that hold. Since I felt he was ready for it, I told him I'd teach it to him right then and there. I had him sit down on the mat and showed him the correct position—left elbow slightly under the opponent's chin, right hand pressing on the correct nerve. I repeated the instructions three times.

"'I think I've got it now,' he told me.

"'Good,' I said. 'Try it on me.'

"Jim put the hold on perfectly. As a matter of fact, I almost blacked out twice. He learned fast and I was thrilled. I'd finally found a partner I liked, and more important-



ly, one in whom I had confidence. My dream of taking Graham and Tyler's title was coming closer and closer.

"Jim was no disappointment. Every match wound up with him putting the Sleeper on one of our opponents. He was becoming an expert at it. But he was so anxious, like a kid with a new toy, I made sure to impress upon him the importance of never letting an opponent fall into a deep sleep under any circumstances. 'No matter how much you may detest an opponent regardless of what he might have done to you,' I told him, 'never keep the hold on too long. It can result in brain damage or possibly death!' He assured me he'd remember it.

"Things kept going along fine. I invited him to spend Thanksgiving with me at the reservation and we showed him a real Indian Thanksgiving celebration. Since we were on the road, we even spent Christmas together. I remember he bought a little tree—it must have been about two feet high—and put it in my locker. We exchanged gifts and ate our Christmas turkey in a restaurant. It was really nice since we were both away from home.

"The next few weeks we were booked in separate arenas wrestling as singles. That's when strange things started happening. Jim was

seen keeping company with undesirables, people like Stan Stasiak, Beautiful Bobby and the Grand Wizard. There were rumors he was dining out with the Grand Wizard and going out on the town with him and Stasiak. I tried to call him to find out about it but my calls were never returned.

"Finally, three weeks later, we were booked in Philadelphia as a team. When Jim walked into the dressing room I went over to greet him.

"Hey buddy,' I said, 'how've you been?"

"Okay, I guess,' he said almost mechanically. There was no enthusiasm.

"Then, instead of putting his gear next to mine as he usually did, he put it down next to a locker marked 'The Grand Wizard & Co.' And that company included Stasiak, Beautiful Bobby, and I think Blackjack Mulligan. The the Wizard whispered something in his ear and Valiant came back to where I was sitting.

"Sorry,' he said. 'I had some personal business to attend to.'

"That's all right,' I assured him. 'You all ready for our match?"

"All set,' he replied. 'I've got the Sleeper ready for someone tonight.'

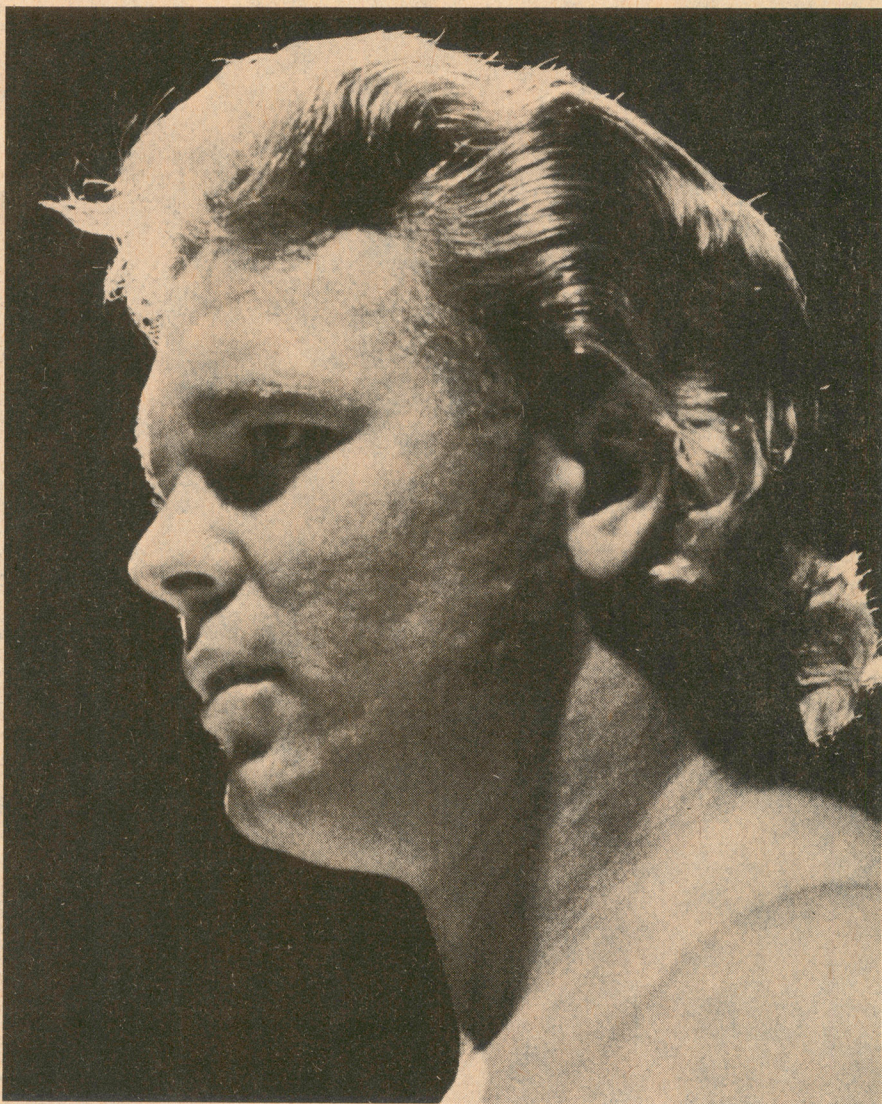

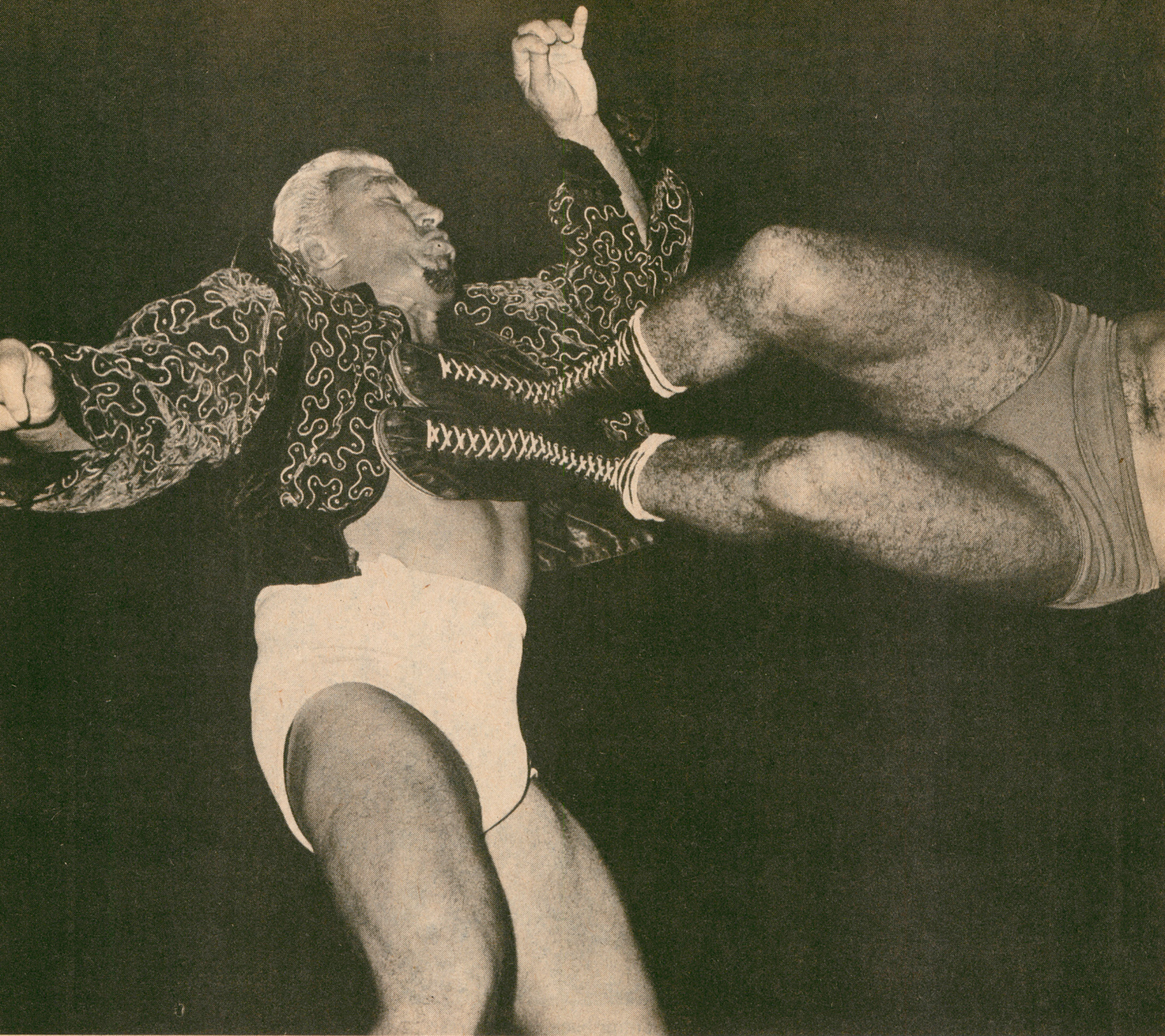
"But I got my answer on television a few days later. The Wizard made a formal statement that he was now managing Jim Valiant. Then Valiant got on.

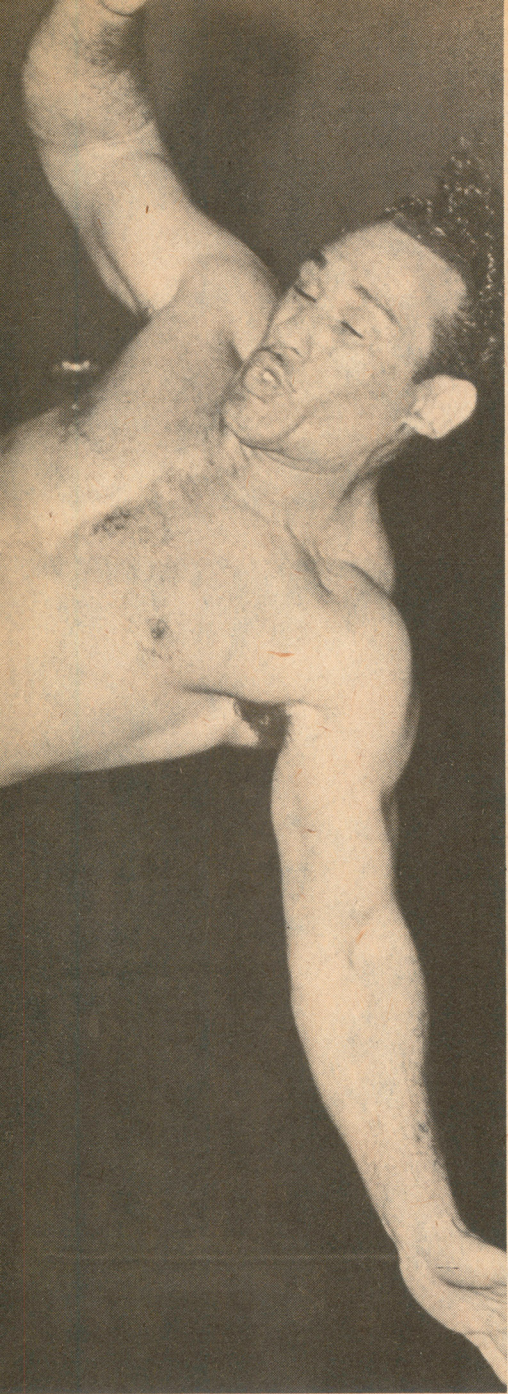

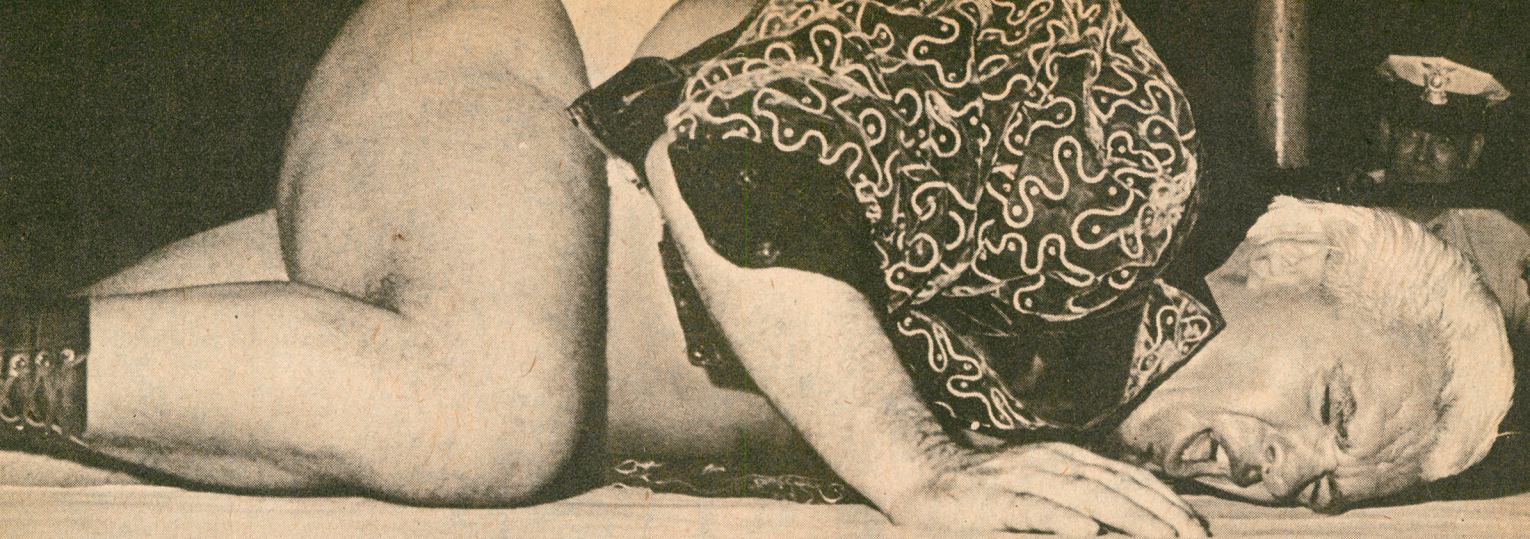

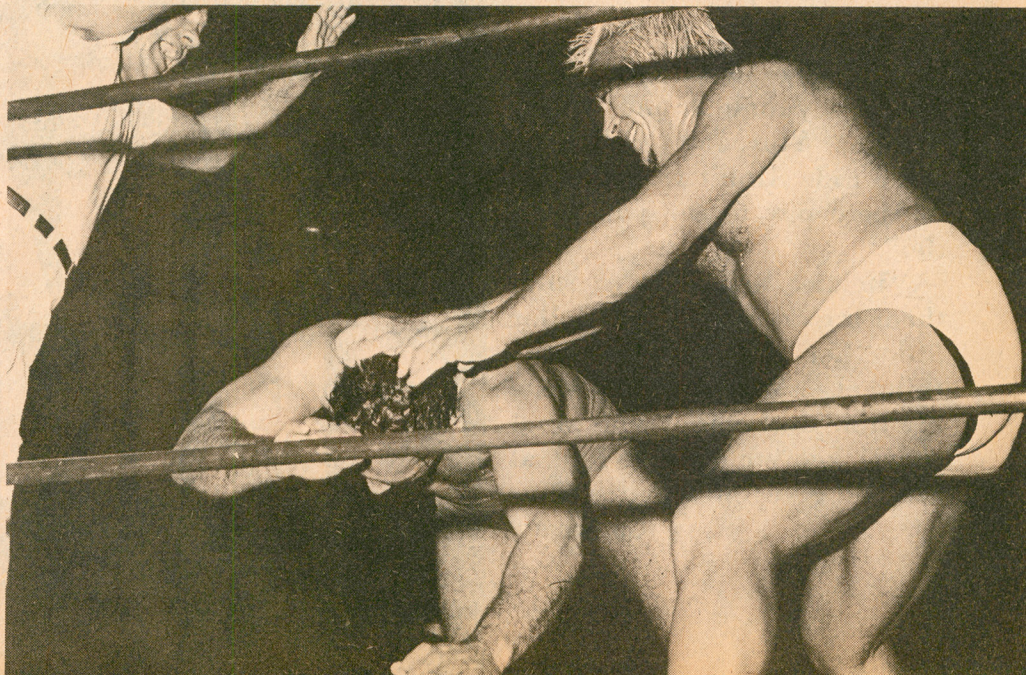

Moving in swiftly, Jacobs jolted the Jungle Man with a knee-drop. Tarzan flopped on his face and Abe pounced on him.

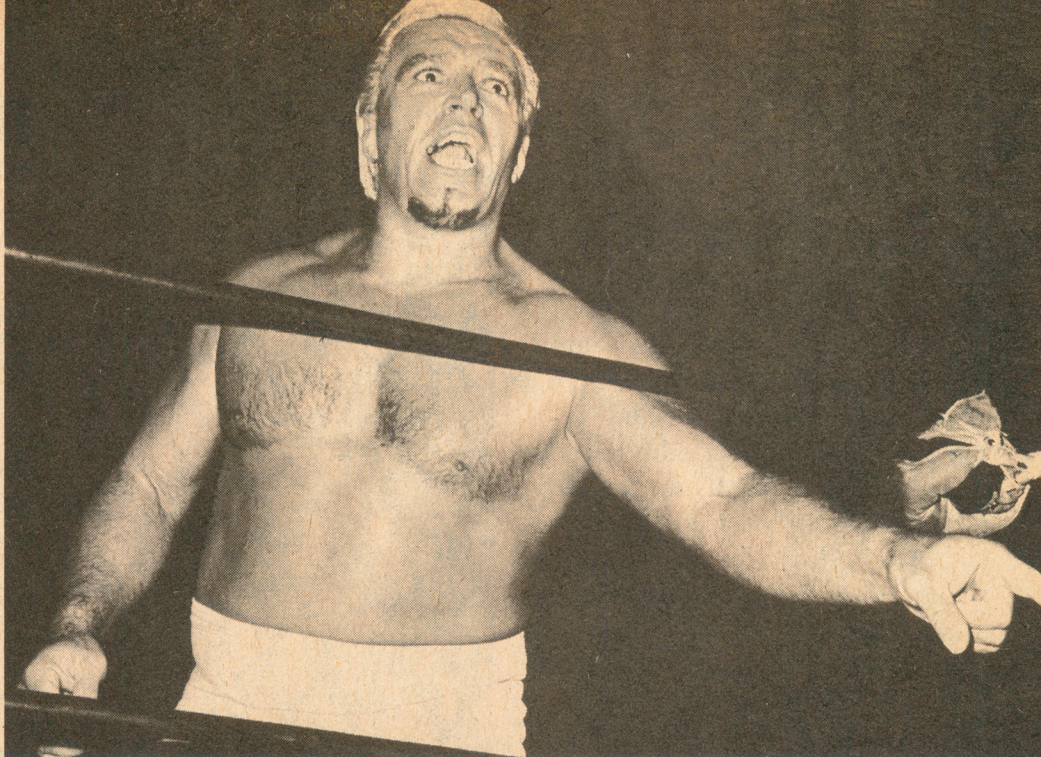
"Give him the Kiwi-Roll!" the crowd shouted, referring to Abe's famous rolling leglock.

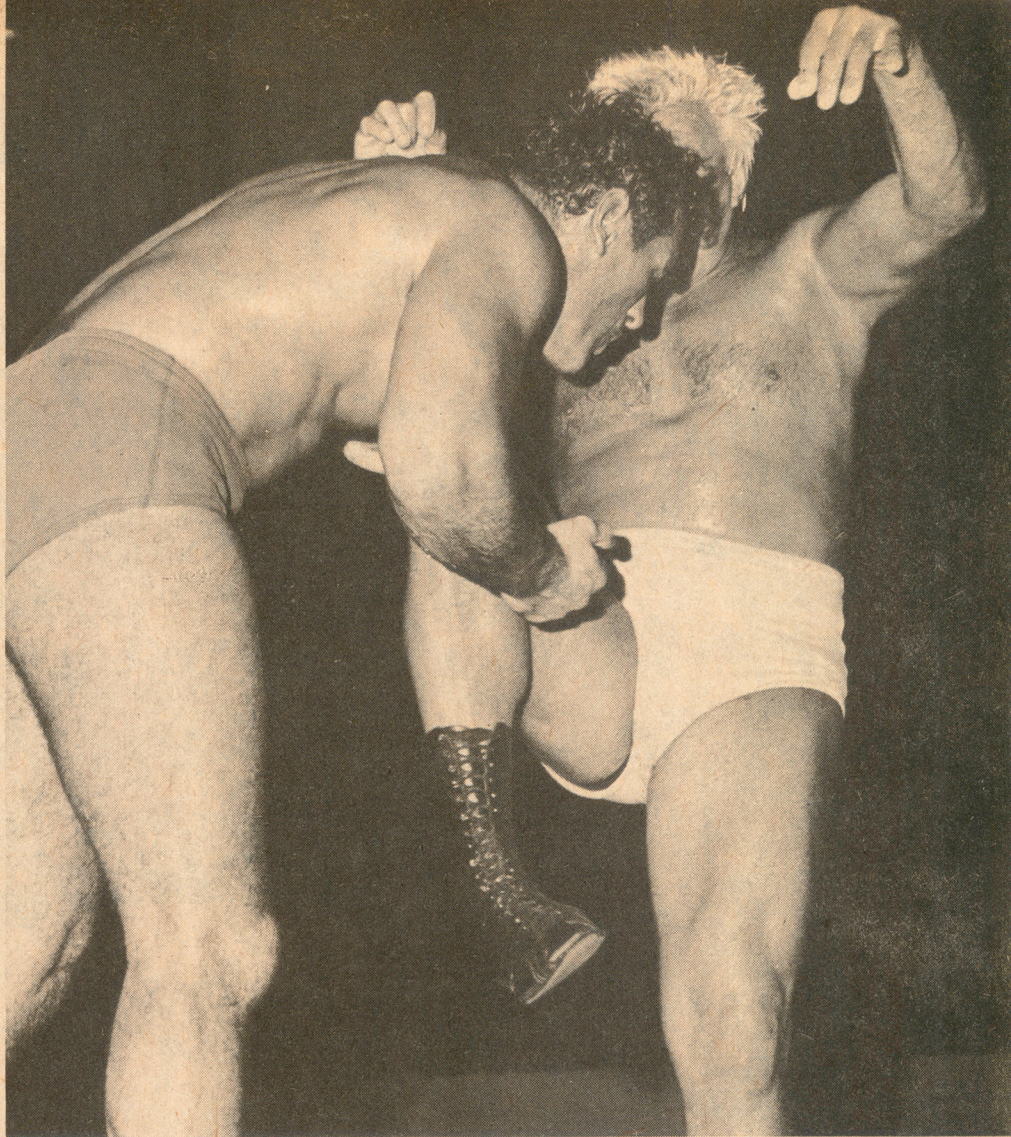

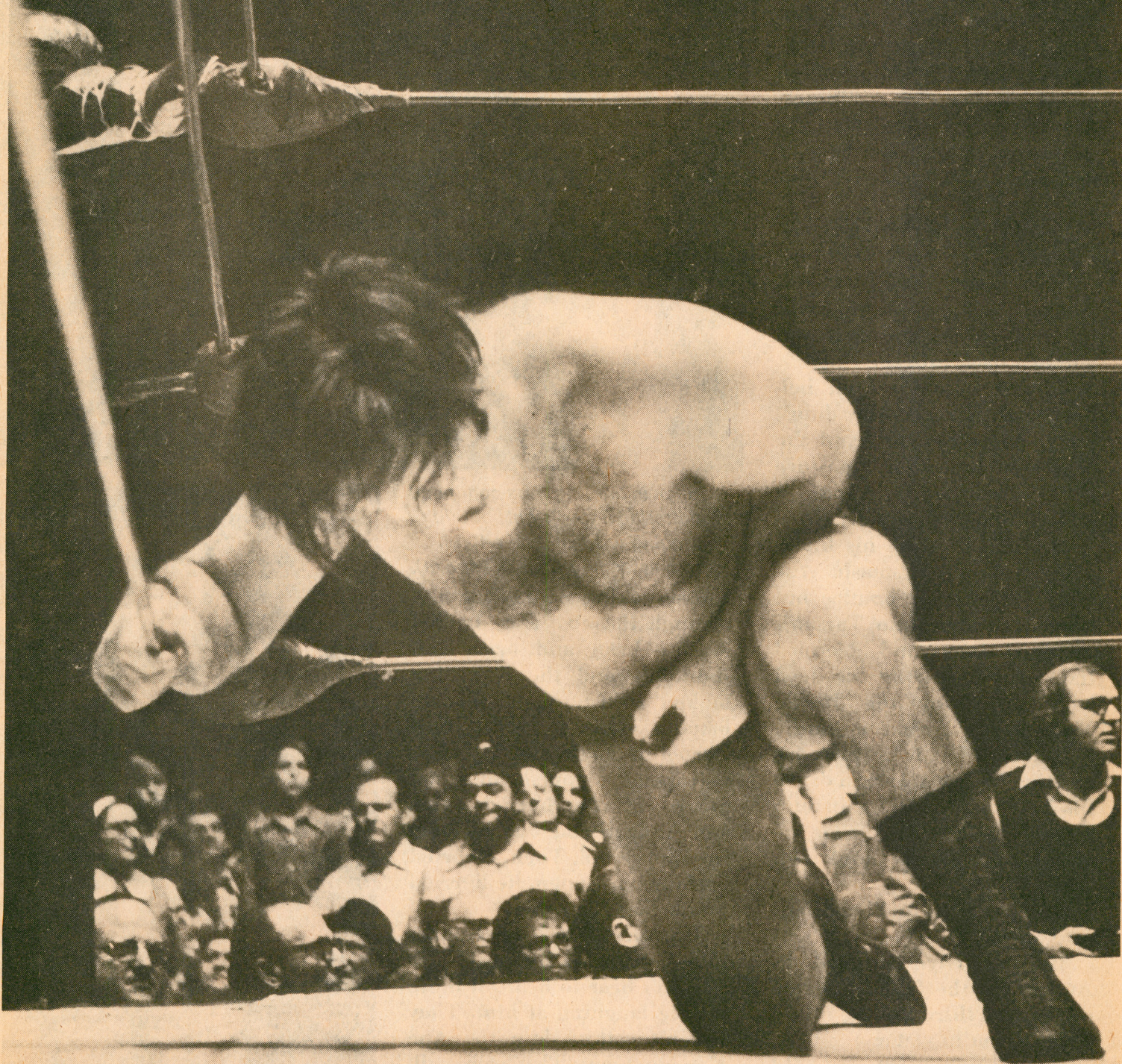
—banana skins came hurtling through the air. They landed on his head and arms and shoulders and the Ape Man looked so funny dancing in banana skins that the fans started to laugh.

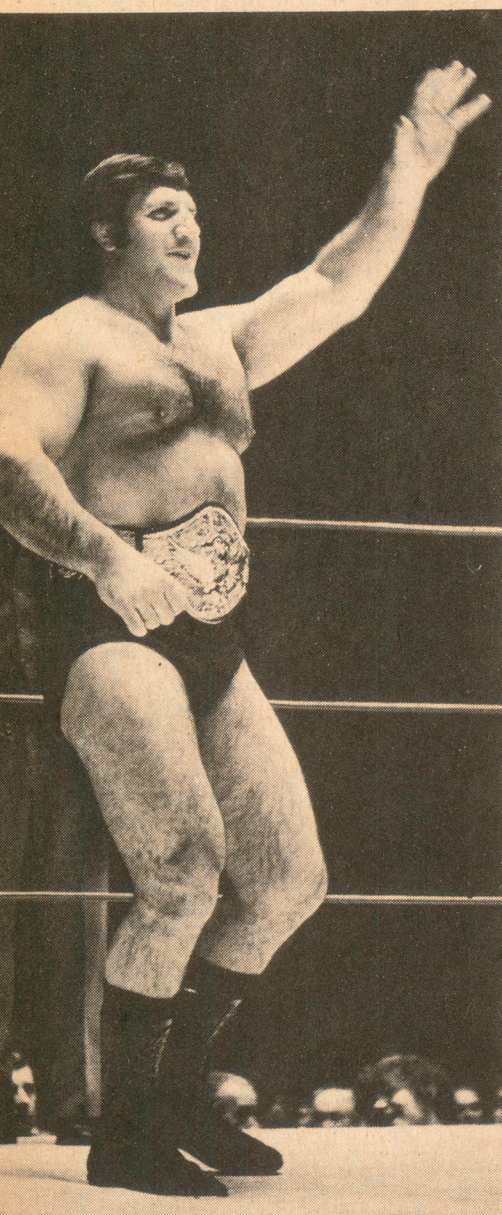

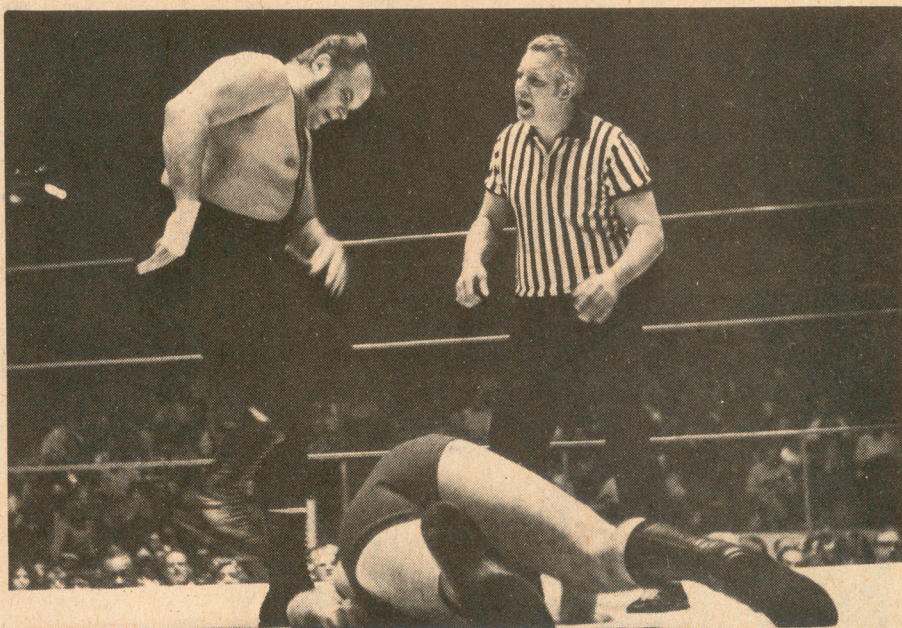

STAN STASIAK WAS going to prove a point. Even if he had to do it using every illegal tactic he could think of, he was determined that nothing would stop him from winning the World Wide Wrestling Federation title back from Bruno Sammartino.

Stasiak lost the belt just nine days after winning it from Pedro Morales.

"It was a fluke," the heart punch expert claimed after the Sammartino match. "Sammartino was granted a lousy New York decision. Everyone in New York City backs Sammartino. That includes the judges, the referees and the officials.

"I thought when Morales lost the title there would be no more of that garbage. But Sammartino's just as protected as Morales was. Remember, I beat Morales outside of New York City, in Pennsylvania, where he

couldn't be protected."

World got around to Bruno and he replied.

"Stan Stasiak is a very capable opponent," he said. "If the World Wide Wrestling Federation deems him the top contender I'll gladly wrestle him."

Stasiak stayed in the number one spot for quite awhile. He was granted a title shot.

"I want it outside of New York," Stasiak demanded. The officials okayed his request. And to go one better, the match was signed in Pennsylvania, the state of Stasiak's greatest achievement, the victory over Morales.

"Ha! I did it you stiff!" Stasiak yelled to Bruno who was still outside the ring. "I'm the champion! I regained the title!"

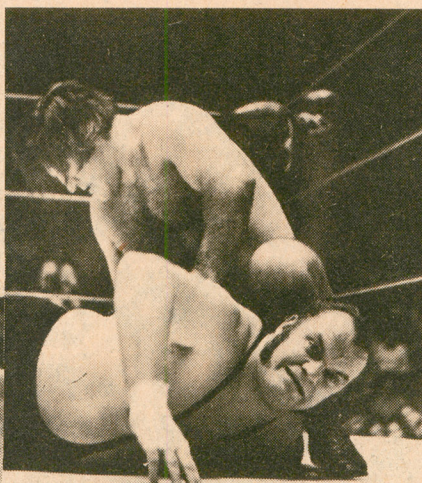
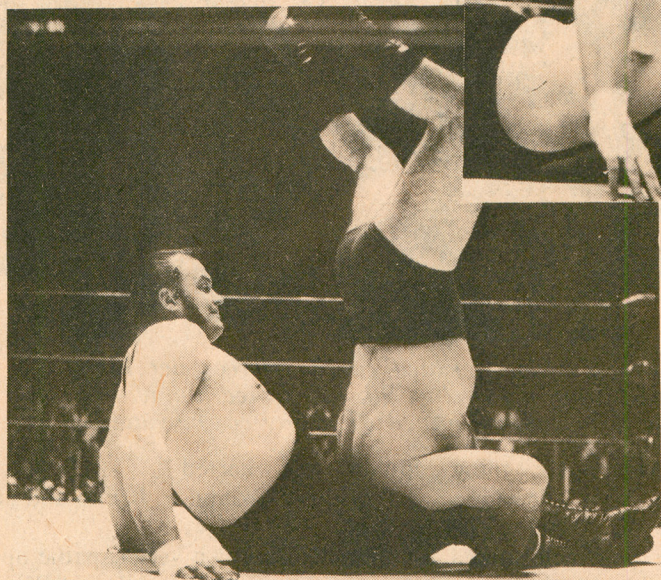

"DAMMIT!" Stasiak screamed. You could hear him a mile away. The next few words out of his mouth are not printable. Let's just say he was badly ticked off.

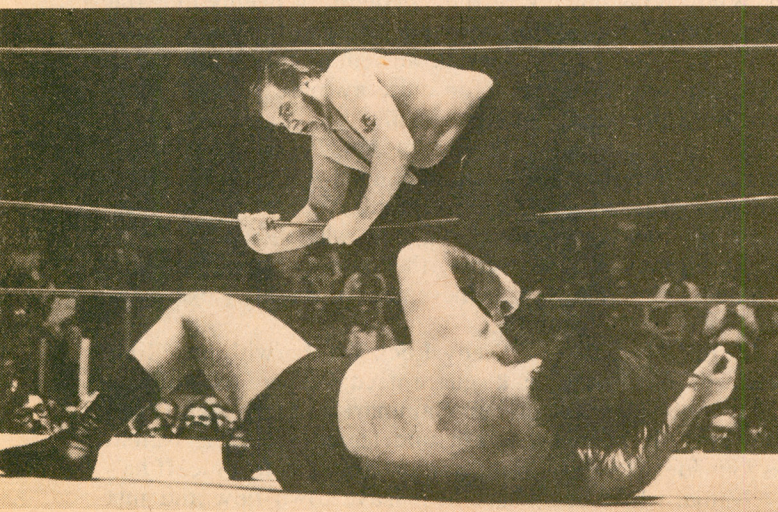
As far as Stasiak is concerned, he won. He's calling himself "champion" whether the W.W.W.F. likes it or not.

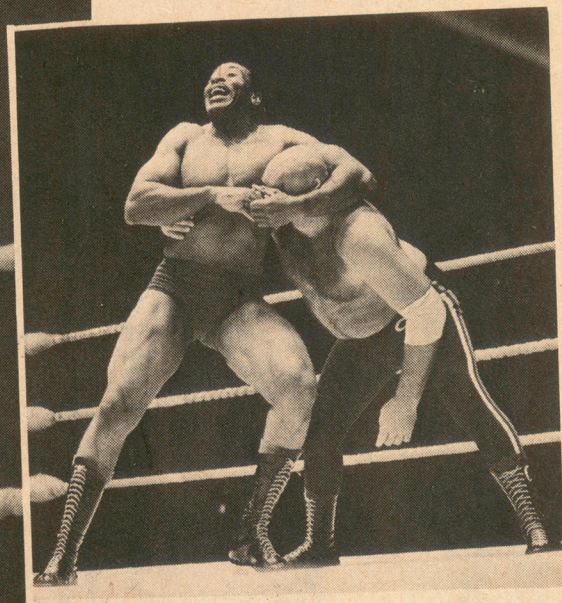
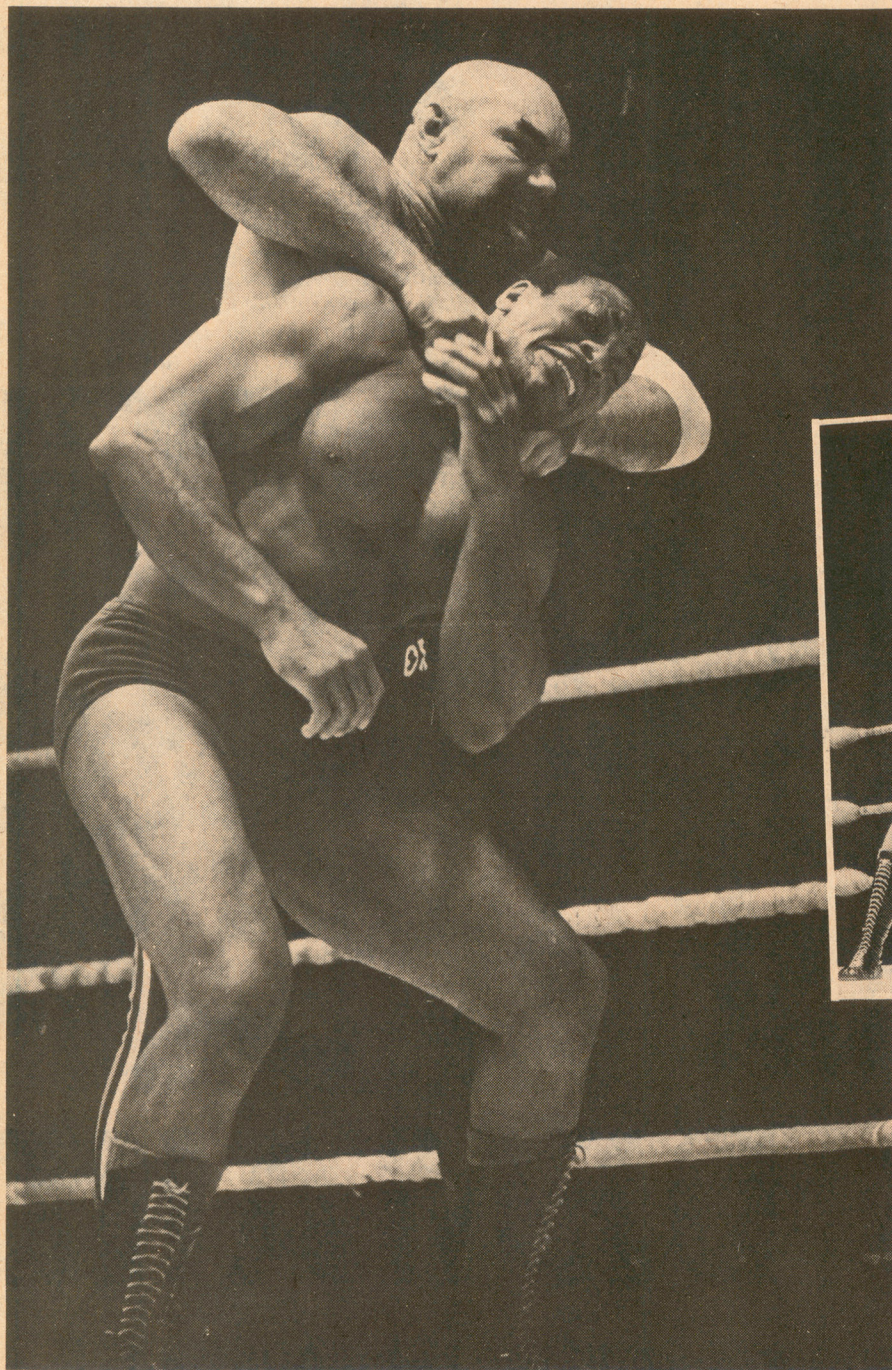

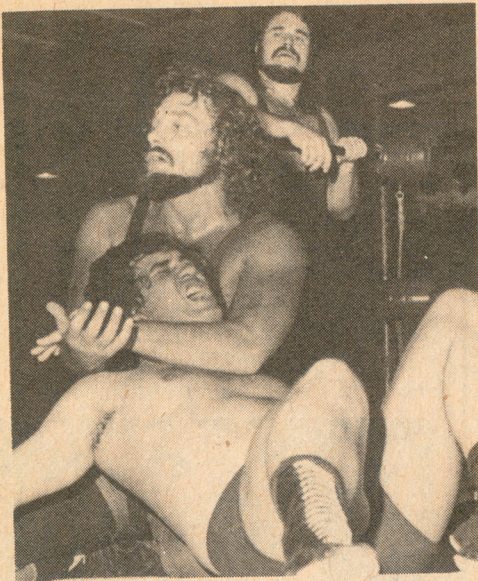

was hapless, helpless, and hopeless. He knew he was done for. And he should have been done for, except for the fact that I, Red Bastien, made the dumbest, stupidest, most ignorant move ever!

"I had Graham coming and going. There were times during the match when he was completely at my mercy. Why didn't I finish him off? Oh, why didn't I finish him off?

In terms of tactics, which team has the better wrestling skills?

"I'd say we have the most devastating tactics," Costello said. "I won't take anything away from them. I hear they're quite rough when they have brass knuckles or boomerangs in their hands. We don't need that sort of thing. No, we rely on our boomerang hold, our 'Koala Clutch', our scientific holds, and most of all our brains. We think our matches through."

The Royal Kangaroos claim they never use foreign objects.

"The only time we use brass knuckles," Boyd said, "is when we're allowed to. That time comes in a brass knuckles tag battle where both teams may use them. As for holds, we are the most scientific tag team on the face of the Earth today. No team can match our teamwork or skill. We are truly unique."

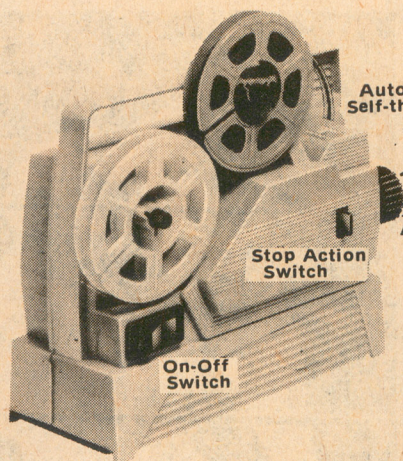
A wrestler, who didn't want to be revealed by name, had this to say:

And no one will ever know unless they do wrestle. Then, just one team will be the "master" Kangaroos team.

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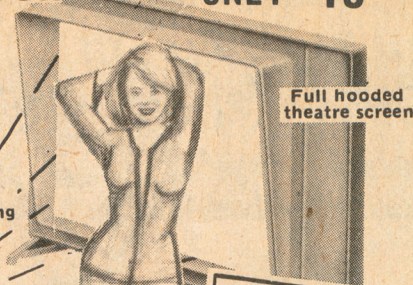

is as dangerous as all chain matches with one grotesque difference—to win, a wrestler must drag his bleeding, unconscious opponent completely around the ring. Often, the gushing blood forms a scarlet circle marking the journey.

Watching Boris train for a chain match is a terrifying experience. He practices slashing the chain with control. The chain is a deadly weapon that requires skill and training to use. Boris wanted to have the chain leap to his command like a vicious watchdog.

Another necessary training ritual is spending hours a day soaking your face in brine. This toughens the skin so that it is more difficult to cut. It is a dull, uncomfortable process. But having your face become slashed into ribbons of flesh is a more uncomfortable process.

Rhodes was going through the same process. Each man knew what he wanted to do and what the consequences might be. You can't take a chain match lightly.

The night of the match arrived and the two wrestlers entered the ring ready for anything. They were connected around their right wrists to a length of thick chain 15 feet long. The two men didn't wait for the bell. All they wanted to hear were the two clicks that assured them they were fastened together.

Then they attacked.

Malenko ran at Rhodes but Dusty was ready. Like a child flicking a garden hose, he made the chain snake along its deadly path until it whipped into Boris' forehead. There was a sickening crack as bone met chain and blood spattered over the ring. Malenko sank to his knees.

Dusty sprang to the side of his fallen opponent. He stood in back and wrapped the chain around his hand.

"It all over now, Boris boob!" Rhodes yelled and began to rake the chain across Malenko's face. Blood began to pour out of the Russian's mouth, nose, and forehead.

The chain slashed back and forth with cruel regularity. But Malenko refused to give Rhodes the satisfaction of hearing an agonized scream.

The torture continued for over a minute when Rhodes decided to end the match. He raised the chain high above his head in an attempt to crash it down on Malenko's already blood-soaked skull. He jumped and came crashing down—on the mat.

Malenko had rolled to one side, more from pain than any skill. But seeing Rhodes lying on the mat temporarily stunned was all he needed to regain his strength.

He wrapped the chain around his fist and smashed the steel knuckles into Rhode's face. He followed the first punch with another, then another, and then another. Soon, Dusty's entire face was obscured by blood.

When he tired of punching, Malenko scraped the chain across Dusty's face. Rhodes fell to the canvas, unconscious.

Boris started to drag Rhodes around the ring, but soon discovered how difficult it is to carry a huge, unconscious man around an entire wrestling ring when you are bleeding and weak. But Boris was determined.

He pulled, strained, and could barely move Rhodes. But the victory was to be his. Slowly, Rhodes began to move. The red stained mat told of his progress. The last quarter of the way Malenko did on his knees, but he did it. The circle of blood was completed.

The referee raised Boris' arm in victory only to have Malenko collapse. The match over, the ring doctor rushed into care for the two men.

While he dressed Malenko's wounds, the doctor told the unconscious winner, "Wake up, Boris, wake up! You won!" □

sure nothing like that happens in wrestling."

One of the most frequently-asked questions we receive is who the referees consider the greatest wrestlers and which matches were the greatest matches they ever handled. We put these to Dick.

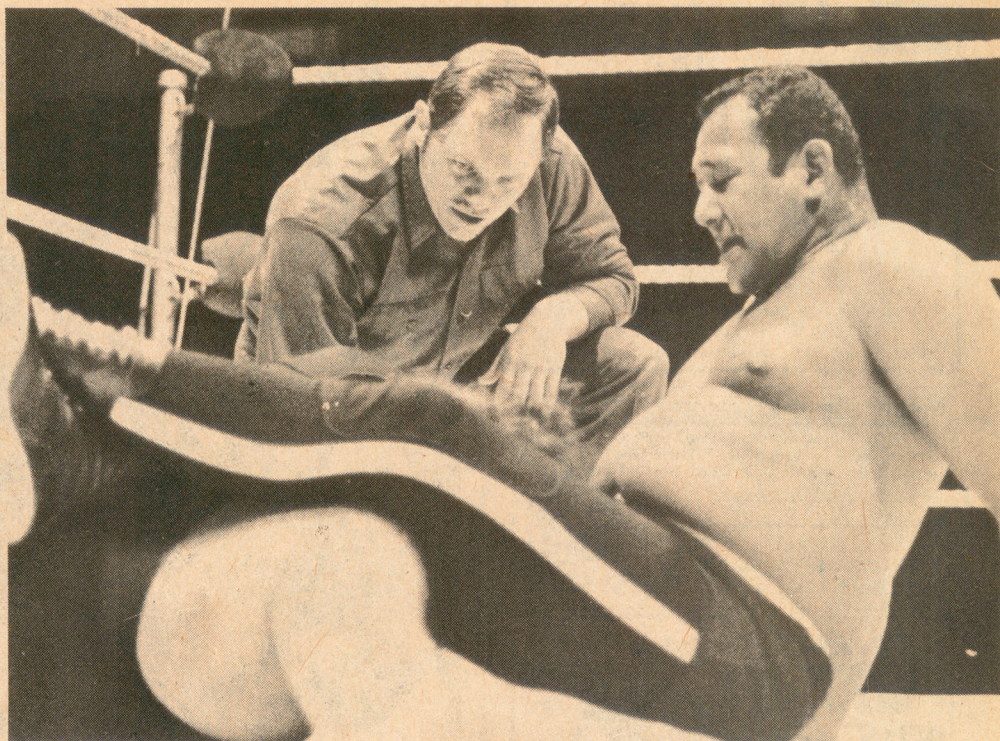
"There are three men whom I consider the greatest wrestlers in the world," he replied, "and I can't separate the three. Verne Gagne, Lou Thesz and Bruno Sammartino are the greatest I ever saw. I refereed in Bruno's matches a number of times and I've handled some of Gagne's matches, although I never refereed a match in which Thesz wrestled.

"Gagne probably impresses me as much as any man in wrestling. The things he does are amazing. Remember, he had a tremendous amateur background and has been a pro for 20 years. His speed, his knowledge of holds and escapes, and his conditioning are unbelievable.

"Sammartino is a different type of wrestler. I think he's the strongest man there is. He doesn't have the quickness or knowledge of holds Gagne does. But Bruno has the biggest heart and greatest amount of courage I've ever seen. Plus his strength is overpowering.

"Thesz combines the best of the other two—strength, speed, conditioning, knowledge of holds and escapes and just plain experience. Remember, he's been going for more than 30 years. That's something.

"But the greatest match I've ever seen was one I had the pleasure of refereeing—the title match between Bruno Sammartino and Ivan Koloff. It was the most surprising match I ever saw. I think I was more stunned than the fans. Just three weeks before, I refereed a six-man tag team match in Washington between Bruno, Bobo Brazil and Gorilla Monsoon against Koloff and the Mongols. Koloff looked absolutely great that night. But when he next faced Bruno three weeks later, there seemed to be no indication that he'd be any tougher than the two other times he wrestled him or the time three weeks prior. I remember Koloff coming off the ropes and pinning Bruno. I began counting. I must have counted to two over Bruno a thousand times, and always the man pinning him

came flying off. That's what I expected this time as well. When I said three I just didn't believe it. I was the most surprised man in the Garden."

The Koloff pin after diving off the top rope was a subject of controversy for quite awhile. Many people contend diving off the top rope is illegal and some promoters have gone so far as to ban it. Are dives off the top rope in the rule book or not?

"The rule says a man cannot use the ropes to pin his opponent," Kroll explained. "As soon as a man begins to climb the ropes I begin a count on him. But as soon as he jumps off the ropes that count ends."

Fans constantly complain that referees seem to penalize the scientific wrestlers in tag team matches while letting the dirty wrestlers get away with murder. The illustration is usually given of a referee holding back a wrestler who's trying to come to the rescue of his partner who's getting belted by two villains. Is that the case?

"Sometimes it is," Kroll admitted, "but never purposely. A referee can stop only what he sees. If he sees a man trying to climb into the ring to help his partner, his obligation is to get that man back out of the ring.

What's happening in the corner comes second—because in most instances one of the men in the corner is on the apron where he should be. Usually, it depends which violation a referee sees first. Positioning is very important. Sometimes, because of positioning, a referee might miss a choke or trunks being pulled that fans on that particular side of the ring can see. Remember. A referee sees only one of four possible angles. He can make judgements only on what he sees."

Do certain wrestlers give referees more trouble than others?

"Most definitely. Guys like Killer Kowalski and Baron Von Raschke are very hard to handle because, they'd just as soon push you away or throw you out of the ring to get at their opponent. When someone like that is wrestling I prepare myself for a rough match, although I try to remain totally objective at all times. I know there are some wrestlers who have reputations for bending the rules a bit more than others. But when I'm in there each match is a new match and I try to stay totally objective."

Are referees friends with any wrestlers?

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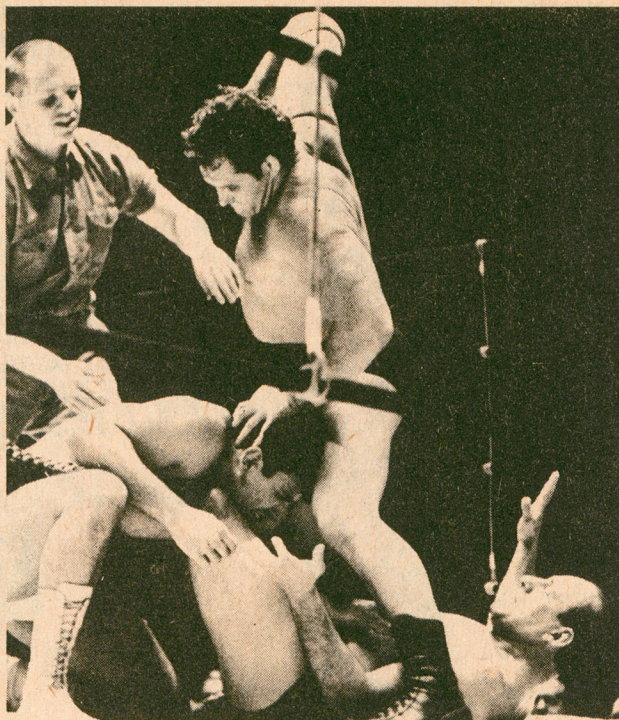
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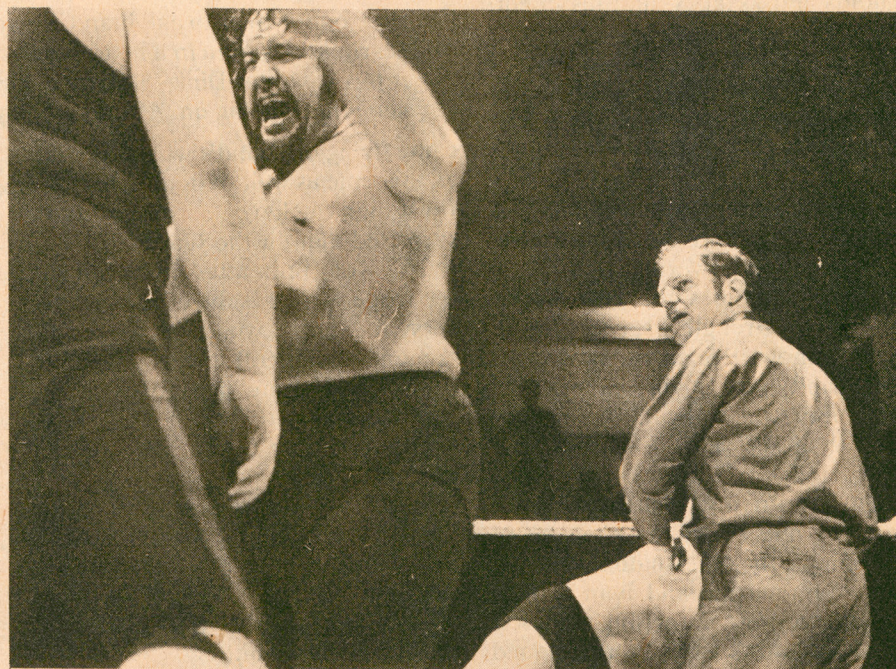
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A REFEREE ANSWERS YOUR QUESTIONS

"No. Under no circumstances. We'll talk to them if we meet on the street or see them in the locker room before a match. But we never travel together, go to parties together or socialize together. It wouldn't be fair for me to make friends with some wrestlers. What would happen if I refereed their matches? I'd be accused of showing favoritism. That's

one thing a referee fears most. That's why a referee leads a very lonely existence."

Who among the younger wrestlers do you think will be a superstar?

"One man who impressed me immensely is that English kid Billy Robinson. In fact, I'd say that right now he's better than Verne Gagne! I think if they wrestled each other Robinson would lick him. Of course Robinson is just starting to reach his peak while Verne has been on top for years. A few years ago Gagne

would have beaten him. But today I think Robinson would win."

What does a referee do when he's not refereeing?

"Believe it or not—I like to go to wrestling matches. When I referee a match it's work. I can't sit back and enjoy it. I'm too busy. So I enjoy going to matches as a spectator. But to tell you the truth, I spend as much time watching the referee as I do watching the wrestlers. I remember one time there was an obvious choke, but the referee didn't see it because he was positioned on the opposite side of the ring. The fans on my side saw it and started yelling and screaming. By the time the referee came around to my side the wrestler had let go of the choke and turned it into a chinlock. When the referee went back to the other side—wham—the choke again. The fans began screaming again. I knew exactly what that poor referee was going through. I've been through it myself."

What moment does the referee fear the most?

"There are two things a referee fears. The first is not seeing an obvious infraction of the rules that could seriously injure a wrestler. The second is when a wrestler brings a weapon or some kind of foreign object into the ring. We search them as best we can but some still get through. I think any wrestler caught bringing a foreign object into the ring should be suspended for 30 days the first time it happens and for a year the second time."

Is there anything you'd like to tell the fans before we end the interview?

"Yes. I'd just like to remind them that referees always do the best they can, but no man is capable of seeing everything going on in the ring. Also, referees do not play favorites or bend over backwards before disqualifying a villain as some fans claim. Fans scream when a villain does something the referee misses. But have you ever heard one scream when a popular wrestler hauls off and belts his opponent? No. They're happy when that happens. I'd just like to remind the fans that their favorites would be in a lot more trouble if there weren't referees around to keep things as clean as possible."

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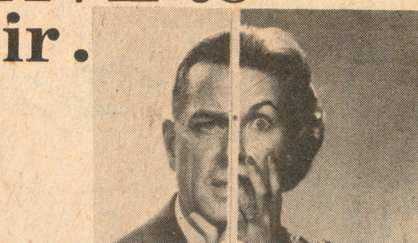
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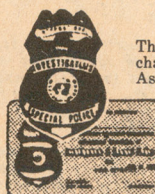
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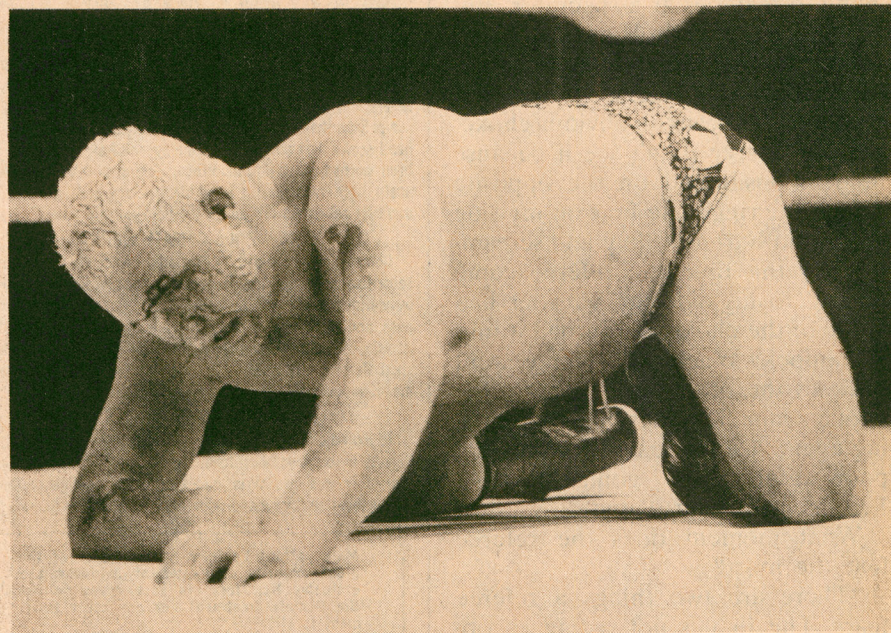

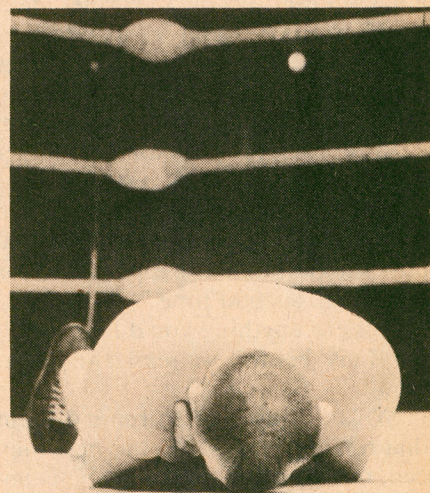
As much as Race dislikes Kiniski, his hatred for Brisco is even deeper.

"Kiniski's a yellow-bellied punk," Race stated, "but he's not as yellow as Brisco. At least Kiniski put his Missouri state title on the line against me, even if he did run like a scared rabbit after I murdered him."

"But Brisco doesn't even have the guts to face me now that I'm back in top form. He's running away BEFORE the match. At least Kiniski had the guts to run away afterwards."

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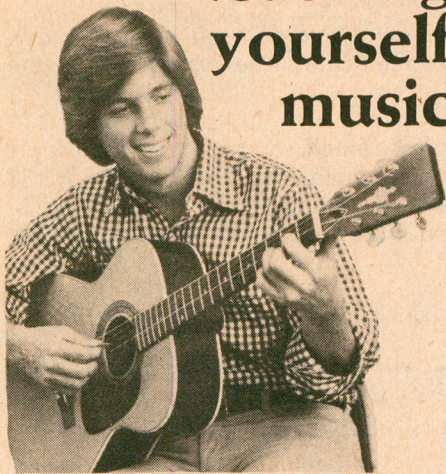
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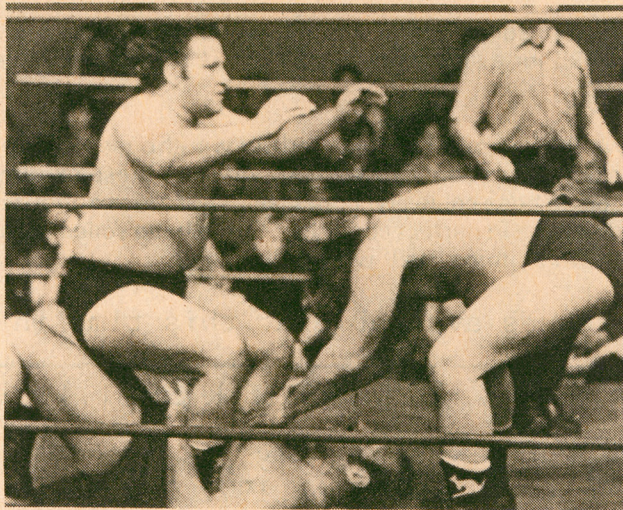

shape or form. Keep repeating our names, Al Costello and Don Kent, the *original* Fabulous Kangaroos.

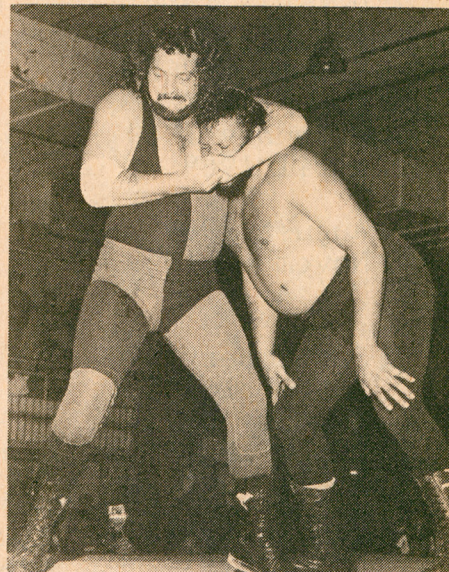

Even though both teams claim no resemblance, both teams do indeed wear Australian bush hats and carry boomerangs.

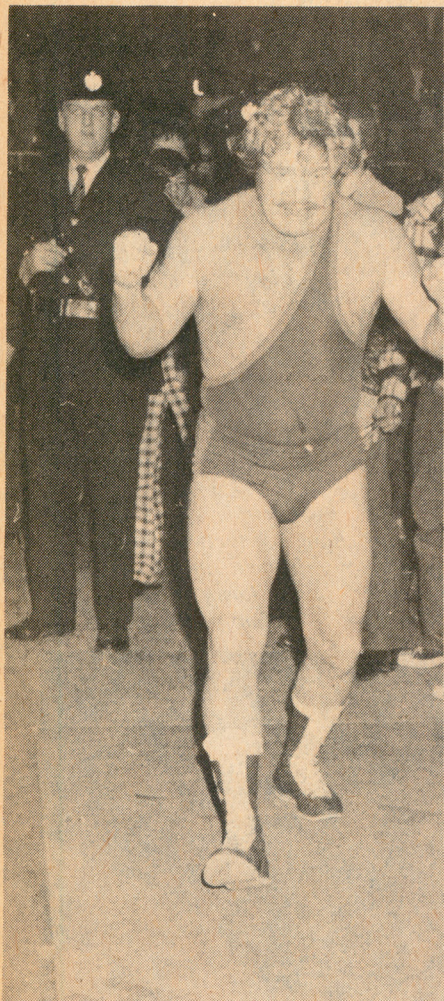

Graham did look very sincere, groveling at Bastien's feet. The next time he may be ground beneath those very same feet. ☐



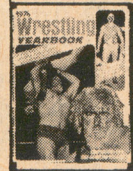
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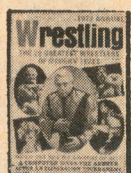


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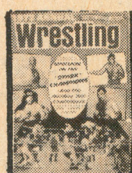
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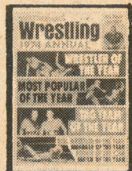
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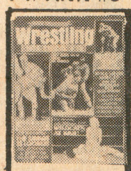
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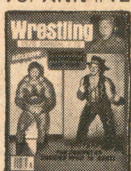
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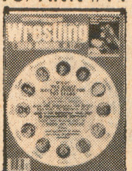
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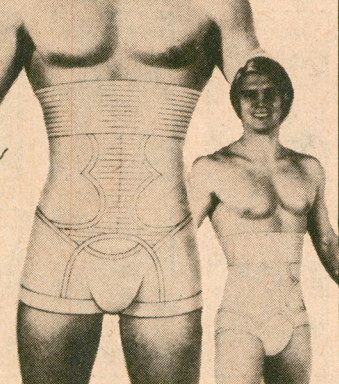
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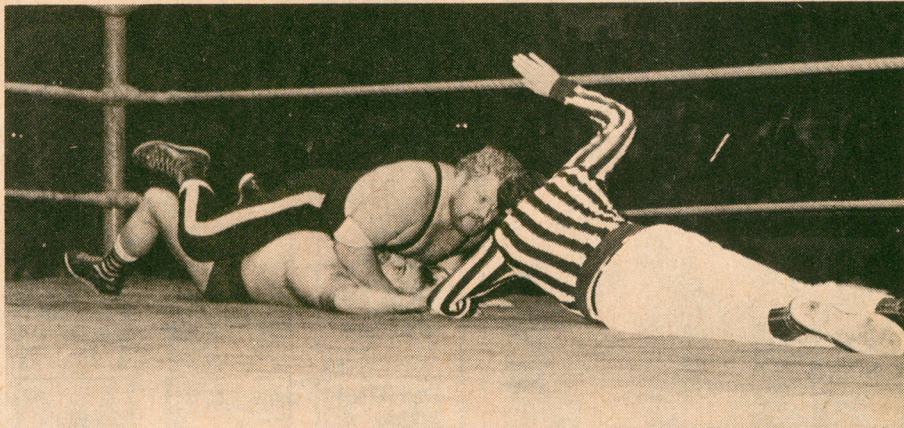
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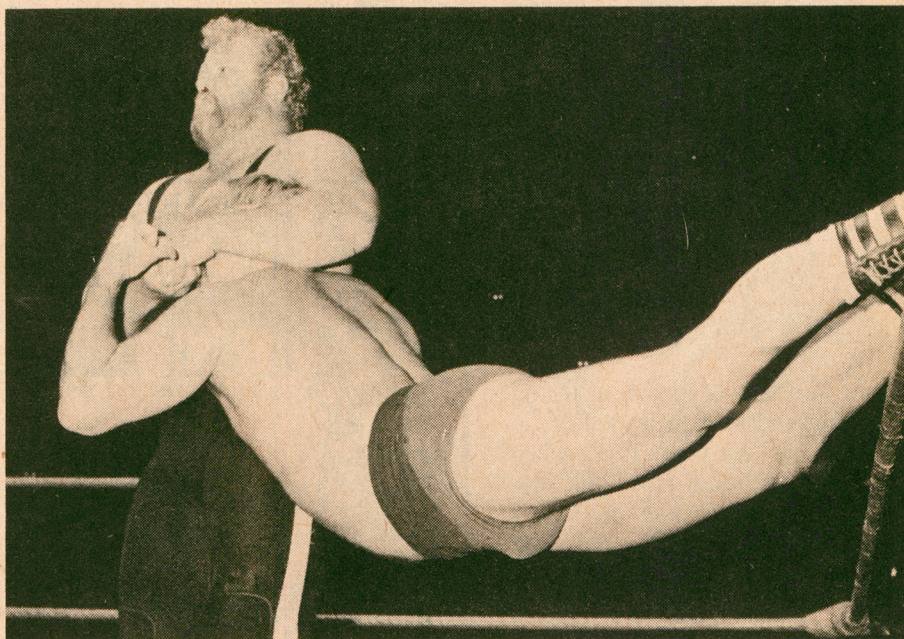

"It was tough but I did it. And I'm proud." □

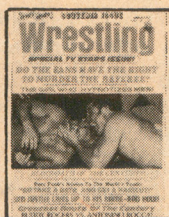
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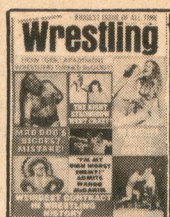
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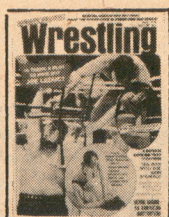
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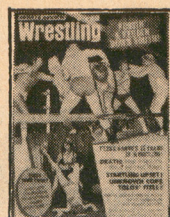
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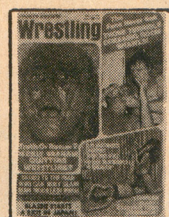
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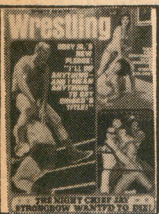
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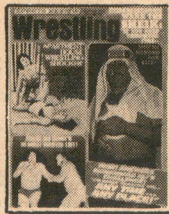
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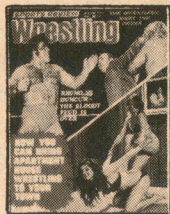
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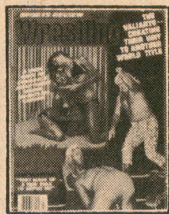
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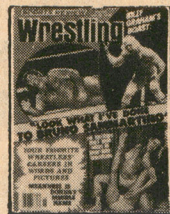
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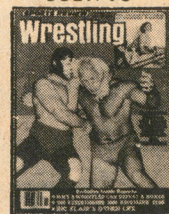
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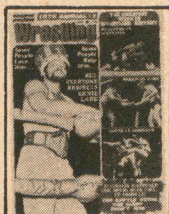
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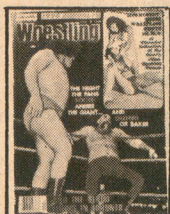
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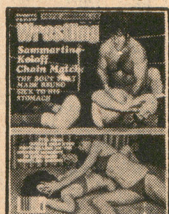
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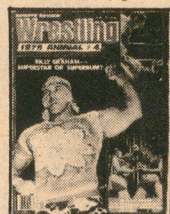
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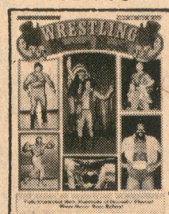
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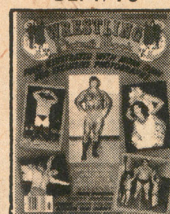
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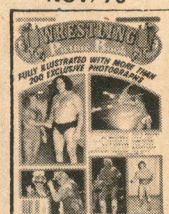
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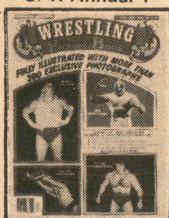
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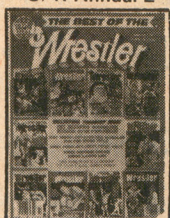
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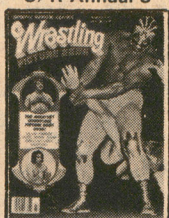
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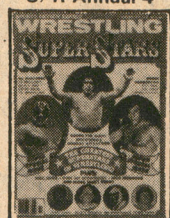
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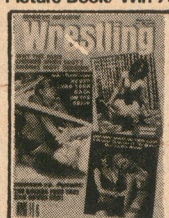
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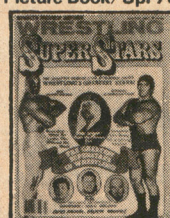
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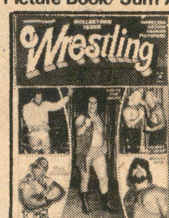
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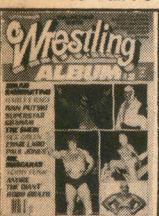
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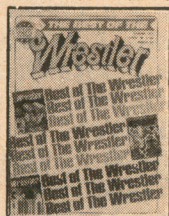
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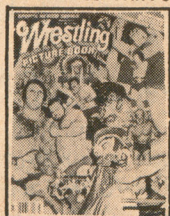
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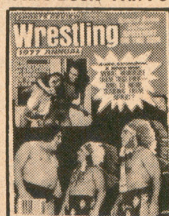
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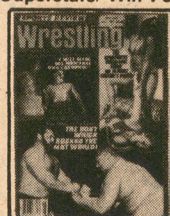
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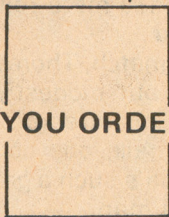
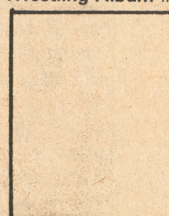
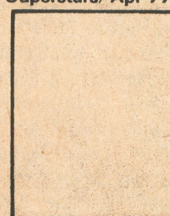
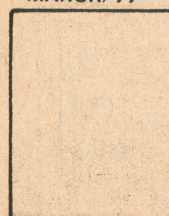
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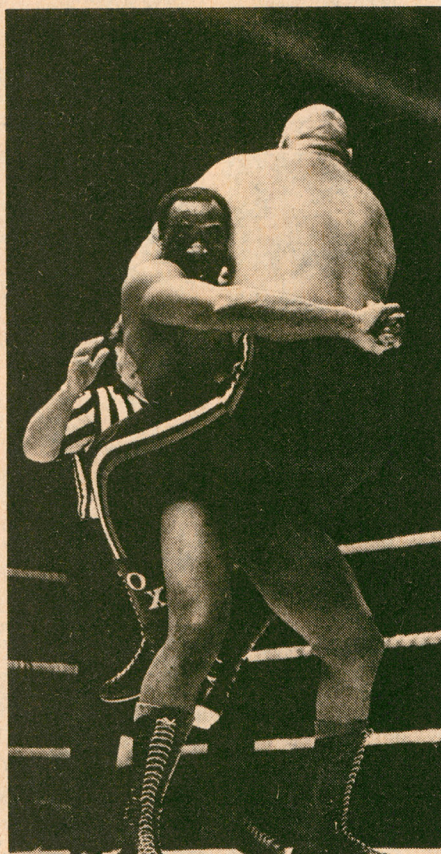

After the match, Thomas responded openly but modestly to questions about his strength. Listening to the man talk, one could understand why he's such a great athlete and beloved man.

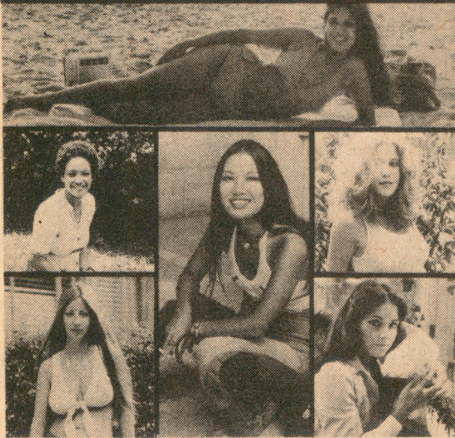

Ox Baker, and many others, wish Art would abuse his gifts just a little. They'd feel a lot better after a match and save money on liniment. □

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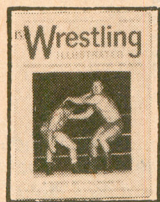

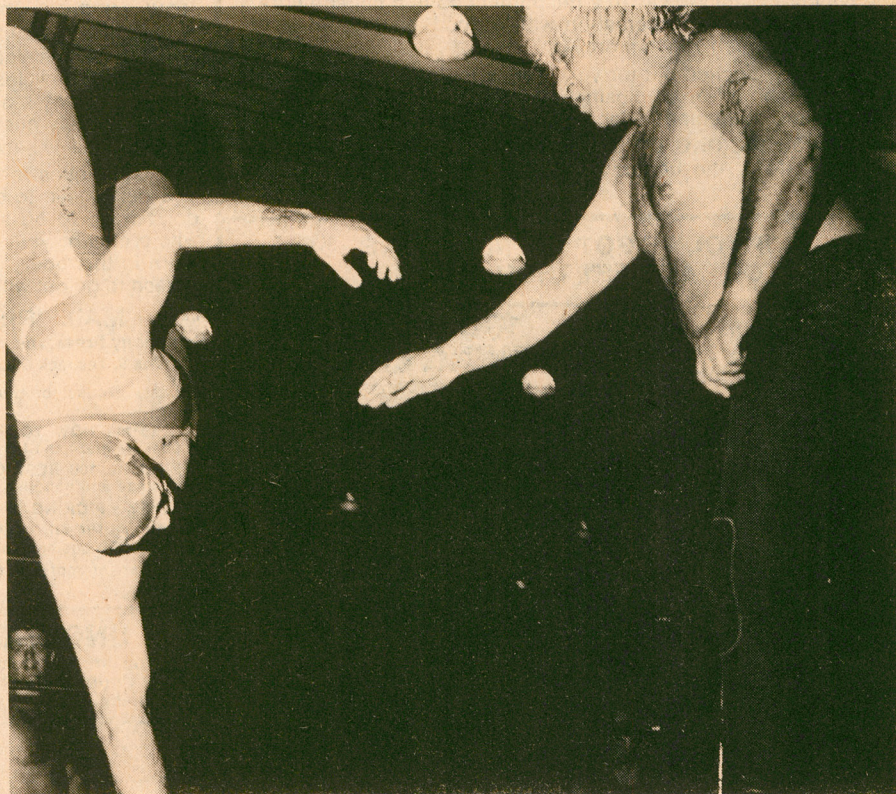

Both men entered the arena slowly, discovering who his opponent had chosen. Neither man was happy



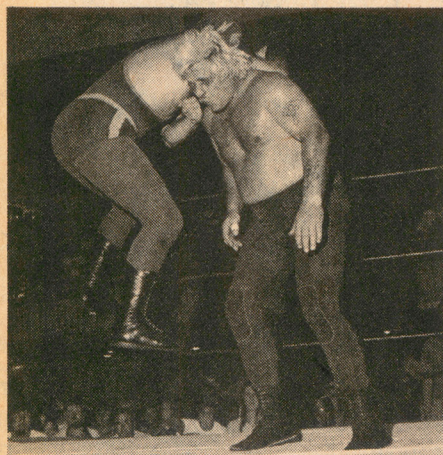
